Order Declaring result of Election- Souls Chapel

On this the 26th day of June 1905 came on to be considered the returns of an Election held at Souls Chapel in School Dist. No. 12, Upshur County, Texas, on the 13th day of June A. D. 1905, to determine whether or not there shall annually be levied and collected in said Souls Chapel School Dist. No. 12, an advalorum tax of 20 cents on the \$100.00 valuation on all taxable property in said School dist.

And it appearing from said returns, duly and lawfully made, that there were cast at said election 25 votes of which number 23 votes were cast "for the tax" and 2 votes were cast "against the Tax" It is therefore found and declared and so ordered by the Commissioners Court of Upshur County, that Two Thirds of the tax payers voting at said election voted in favor of the levying of said Special Tax, and that the Commissioners Court is authorized to annually levy and collect an advallorum Tax of 20 cents on the \$100.00 valuation in said School District for the support and maintenance of the public Schools in said district.

It is further ordered by the Commissioners Court of Upshur County that there is hereby levied for the year 1905, on all real property situated and all property owned within the limits of said Souls Chapel School District No. 12 on the first day of January of the current year except, so much thereof as may be exempt by the Constitution and laws of this State or the United States, an advallorum Tax of and at the rate of 20 cents on the One Hundred Dollars Cash value thereof, estimated in lawful currency of the United States, for the support and maintenance of public Free Schools in Soul's Chapel School Dist. No. 12, Upshur County, Texas.

Order declaring result of Election-Rosewood

On this the 26th, day of June 1905, came on to be considered the returns of an election held 13th day of June A. D. 1905, at Rosewood, in Essex School Dist. No. 15, Upshur County, Texas to determine whether or not an advallorum tax of 20 cents on the \$100.00 valuation shall be annually levied and collected in said School Dist. No. 15.

It appearing from said returns duly and lawfully made that there were cast at said Election 43 votes of which number 20 votes were cast "for the Tax" and 23 votes "against the tax" It is therefore found and declared and so ordered by the Commissioners Court of Upshur County, that two thirds of the tax paying votes did not vote "for the tax" and that the Commissioners Court of this County is not authorized to make a special levy in said school Dist No. 15
