Said bonds shall be numbered consecutively from one to 20 inclusive and shall be of the denomination of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each, aggregating Two Thousand (\$2000.00) Dollars. They shall be dated April 10th, 1910, and shall become due and payable 20 years after date, with option for redemption after ten years. They shall bear interest at the rate of 5 percent per annum, payable annually on April 10 of each year.

Principal and interest shall be payable upon presentation and surrender of bonds or proper coupons in lawful money of the United States at Gilmer, Texas, the said bonds shall be signed by the County Judge, counter signed by the county Clerk, and registered by the county treasurer and the seal of the commissioners court shall be impressed upon each of them. the facsimile signatures of the county Judge and the county clerk may be lithographed, engraved or printed on the coupons.

It is further ordered by the court that, to pay interest on said bonds and create a sinking fund sufficient to discharge them at maturity, a tax of and at the rate of 25 cents on each \$100.00 of the assessed valuation of all taxable property subject to taxation in said common school district No. 15 of this county shall be annually levied, assessed and collected upon said property until said bonds, with interest, are paid, and said tax is here now levied for the year 1910.
