And it appearing to the Court that said election was fairly held and said returns are made in compliance with law, and it further appearing to the Court that the total number of votes cast at said election was 130, which were as follows to-wit:

For Stock Law - - - 62 Votes,
 Against Stock Law - - 68 votes.

It therefore appearing that a majority of 6 votes were cast against Stock Law.
