Ling and East boundary line of J.W. Claghorn surveys. That the said lines are hereby declared a public Highway as far as Lillys Creek to be known as Gilmer & Pittsburg road; Thence in a North Westerly direction and intersect old Gilmer & Pittsburg road about 250 yards North of Lillys Creek bridge.
