PROCLAMATION STOCK LAW ELECTION.

The State of Texas
 County of Upshur.

WHEREAS, the Commissioner's Court of Upshur County Texas on the 15th day of August A D 1913, passed an order for an election to be held within the limits of a sub-division of said Upshur County, hereinafter described, to determine whether or not horses, mules, jacks, jennetts and cattle should be permitted to run at large within the limits of said sub-division of Upshur County, described as follows;

Beginning at the North West corner of Upshur County; Thence running East with the boundary line between Upshur & Camp Counties to a point North East of the town of LaFayette, Upshur County, Texas, where the said boundary line crosses the E B line of the N Davis headright survey;

Thence S. 20 E with said line pass the N E corner of the John Parmer headright survey, continuing S 20 E with the E B line of said John Parmer H R survey to the S E corner of same. Thence S 70 W with the S B line of said John Parmer H R survey to the center of the Public road leading from LaFayette to Gilmer, via Cox School house; Thence Southwestwardly with said road to a point due North of the N E corner of the W H Hereford survey; Thence South with the E B line of said Hereford survey to the S E corner of same; Thence West with the S B line of same to the E B line of the town of Gilmer. Thence South with said line to the S E corner of the present corporation of said town of Gilmer, same being the S E corner of Block No 86 of Dobyns Addition to said town; Thence West and Southwestwardly with said corporation line to the S W corner of same. Thence North 50 feet to the center of the track of the Marshall & East Texas R R; Thence in a westwardly direction with the center of said railroad track to where it intersects the Wood County line; Thence North with said Wood County line of the place of beginning.

And thereafter for more than thirty days previous to said election said order was duly published in the Upshur County Echo, news paper published in said Upshur County; and whereas said election was on the 27th day of September 1913 held in and for said sub-division of said county at the voting places designated in said order according to law;

And Whereas on the 7th day of October 1913, the returns of said election were opened and tabulated by the County Judge of said County in the presence of J C McDonald County Clerk of said County, and R A Muncrief and J L George two respectable freeholders of said county;

And whereas, it appears from said returns that 270 votes were cast "For the Stock Law" and that 232 votes were cast "Against the Stock Law."

Now, therefore, I, W H McClelland, County Judge in and for Upshur County, Texas, do hereby declare and proclaim that a majority of the votes cast at said election were "For the Stock Law" and that said election has resulted in favor of the stock law in and for said sub-division of Upshur County as above described, and that after the expiration of thirty days from date hereof, it shall be unlawful to permit to run at large any horses, mules, jacks, jennets and cattle within the boundaries of said sub-division of Upshur County Texas.
