Court was opened at 10 o'clock by proclamation of the Sheriff, when the following proceedings, among others, were had;

On the 14 day of Sept 1914 the Commissioners Court of Upshur County convened in regular session at a regular term of said court all the members thereof, to wit; W H McClelland County Jdgs, J E Glover, Commissioner Precinct No 1, L J Dalrymple, Commissioner Precinct No 1, A Earp, Commissioner Precinct No 3, W R Arrington, Commissioner Precinct No 4, being present and among other proceedings had, passed the following order:

Whereas, at an election held for the purpose on the 2 day of August 1913, a majority of the qualified property taxpaying voters of Common School District No 9 of this county voting at said election, voted in favor of the issuance of the bonds hereinafter described, and in favor of the tax hereinafter levied;

It is therefore ordered by the Commissioners Court of Upshur County, that the bonds of said county to be called "Common School District No 9 School House Bonds" be issued on the faith and credit of Common School District No 9 of said County, as established by order of the Commissioners Court of said County passed at a former date and ratified by a general order of ratification of all existing school district of Upshur County, passed on the 14 day of May 1903, and recorded in the minutes of the Commissioners court of Upshur County in Volume 3 page 393, said original boundary of School District No 9 was changed as follows, to wit; On Feb 13 1901 said order recorded in Vol 3 page 313; On Oct 24, 1906, said order recorded in Volume 3 page 539; on Aug 12 1907, said order recorded in Volume 3 page 573 & 574. On July 9, 1910 said order recorded in Volume 4 page 96; On Aug 16, 1910, said order recorded in Volume 4 page 105 & 106; On Aug. 17. 1910, said order recorded in Vol 4 page 107; On Nov 15 1910, said order recorded in Volume 4 page 111; On June 16, 1911, said order recorded in Volume 4 pages 175 & 176; Said district was redefined by order of the commissioners court passed at the June term 1914, which order is of record in Book 4 pages 527-28 of the Minutes of said Court, for the purpose of providing funds to be expended in payments of accounts legally contracted in constructing and equipping a public free school building of wooden material within said district; said bonds shall be numbered consecutively from one to 10 inclusive; shall be of the denomination of One Hundred (\$100.00) dollars each, aggregating One Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars.

They shall be dated July 10, 1914, and shall become due and payable 15 years after date, with option of redemption after five years.

They shall bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum, payable annually April 10 of each year.

Principal and interest shall be payable upon presentation and surrender of bonds or proper coupons in lawful money of the United States at Gilmer, Texas, or at Austin Texas at the option of the holder.

Said bonds shall be signed by the County Judge, Countersigned by the County Clerk, and

It is hereby ordered by the Commissioners Court in regular session, September term A D 1914, that the limits, boundaries and corners, together with the objects described hereinafter, shall constitute the field notes of metes and bounds of Cox School House Common School Dist No 6 of Upshur County, Texas; and that said district be and the same is hereby redefined conforming in every respect to the territory in said district as it existed at the time of the recent election for the issuance of bonds on the faith and credit of said district and to the field notes returned by the County surveyor of Upshur County, Texas, from a recent survey made of said district, namely June, 1914, said field notes of which are as follows;

Said bonds shall be numbered consecutively from one to 10 inclusive; shall be of the denomination of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each, aggregating One Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars.

They shall be dated Oct 10th 1914 and shall become due and payable 20 years after date, with option of redemption after five years.

They shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable annually on April 10th of each year.

Principal and interest shall be payable upon presentation and surrender of bonds or proper coupons in lawful money of the United States at Gilmer Texas or At Austin Texas, at the option of the holder.

The said bonds shall be signed by the County Judge, countersigned by the County Clerk and registered by the County Treasurer, and the seal of the Commissioners Court shall be impressed upon each of them. The ~~same~~ similar signatures of the County Judge and County clerk may be lithographed, engraved or printed on the coupons.

It is further ordered by the court that, to pay interest on said bonds and create a sinking fund sufficient to discharge them at maturity, a tax of and at the rate of 25 cents on each one hundred dollars of the assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation in said common school district No 6 of this county shall be annually levied, assessed and collected upon said property until said bonds, with interest, are paid, and said tax is here now levied for the year 1914.

It is further ordered that the order passed on the 13th day of July 1914 by the Commissioners Court of Upshur County for the issuance of bond on the faith and credit of common School District No 6 of this county be and the same is hereby repealed, and that this order shall hold in lieu of same.
