

Whereas, on the 12th day of October, 1913, a petition was presented to me for an election in Common School District No 29 of this county on the question of issuing bonds to provide funds to be expended in payment of accounts legally contracted in constructing and equipping a public free school building of wooden material and purchasing a site therefor within said district and authorizing a tax upon all taxable property within said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity, said petition bearing the requisite number of signatures of property taxpaying voters of said district and being in every respect in conformity with law; and, it appearing that Upshur contains a population of more than 10,000 according to the last United States Census; and

it further appearing that said Common school district No 29 has been heretofore on, to wit; the 14th day of May, 1903, properly established in accordance with Article 2817, Revised Statutes of Texas, 1911; and

It further appearing that said district as so established contains an area of more than nine square miles, and that no other district has been reduced in area below nine square miles by reason of the creation of this district; and

It further appearing that said district No 29 does not embrace any territory that was taken from any other school district (either common or independent), that had an outstanding issue of bonds at the date of such inclusion in this district;

Now, therefore, I, W H McClelland, in my capacity as County Judge of Upshur County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held on the 14th day of November 1914 at Rocky Church in said Common School District No 29 of this county as established by order of the Commissioners court of date the 14th day of May 1903, which is recorded in Vol 3 page 398 on minutes of said court, and as amended Vol 4 page 211 to determine whether a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters of that district desire the issuance of bonds on the faith and credit of said common school district in the amount of \$4000.00 the bonds to be of the denomination of \$100 each, numbered consecutively from one to forty, both inclusive, payable twenty years from their date with option of redemption after five years, and bearing five per cent interest per annum, payable annually April 10th of each year, to provide funds to be expended in payment of accounts legally contracted in constructing and equipping a public free school building of wooden material and purchasing a site therefor within said district, and to determine whether the commissioners court of this county shall be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually while said bonds or any of them are outstanding, a tax upon all taxable property within said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity.

J L Dunagan is hereby appointed presiding officer for said election, and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same, and he shall within five days after said election had been held, make due return thereof to the commissioners court of this county, as it required by law for holding a general election.
