Be it Remembered, That on this the 11 day of Jany 1915, there was begun and holden a regular session of the Honorable Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas, at which were present Hon W H McClelland, Judge presiding, J E Gloyer, Commissioner Precinct No. 1, J W Askins, Commissioner Precinct No. 2, O J Phillips, Commissioner Precinct No. 3, W R Arrington, Commissioner Precinct No. 4, B C Rule Sheriff, C E Florence County Attorney, D Walker County Clerk, and the following proceedings were had, to-wit.

Court was opened at 10 o'clock by proclamation of the sheriff at the court house door, when the following proceedings, among others, were had;

COUNTY OF UPSHUR § In Commissioners Court January 11, 1915.

It is hereby ordered by the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County that the order passed on December 10, 1914, to cancel the bonds of West Mountain District No 30 and to repeal the tax levy for said bonds, be and the same is hereby rescinded, before of the fact that the said bonds of District No 30 were purchased by the State Board of Education on Dec 10, 1914 and hence must be recognized as a binding obligation on the county and district-

County of Upshur § In Commissioners' Court January 11, 1915.

WHEREAS, on the 13th day of July 1914, this court passed an order authorizing the issuance of bonds on the faith and credit of County Line Common School District No 26 composed of territory partly in Upshur and partly in Wood County and levied a tax of and at the rate of 25 cents on the \$100.00 valuation of property to pay interest on and provide a sinking fund for the payment of said bonds; and

WHEREAS the record for said bond issue has not been prepared and it is evidence that said bonds should not bear a 1914 date;

It is therefore ordered by the Commissioners Court of Upshur County that the order above referred to be rescinded and the levy of taxes is hereby repealed and the tax collector is ordered to cease collection of said tax and the officers legally in charge of funds already paid in by taxpayers for purposes above stated are hereby authorized to refund the taxes to the individual tax payers according to the records of the tax collector's office.

 in the boundaries as it existed after the order passed July 17, 1914, it is ordered that the follow-
 ing field notes be adopted and the district shall be recognized as described by said field notes;

Field notes of Mings Chapel District No 23, Upshur County, Texas, Beginning at the
 N W corner of Pattonfield District No 22, a stake for corner in the South line of Gilmer Independent
 District, formerly known as District No 17; Thence West with the South line of Gilmer Independent
 District, at 1526 yrs. the St Louis S W Ry. and at 3555 yrs. pass the S W corner of Gilmer Inde-
 pendent District, and at 3930 yrs. a stake for corner at the N E corner of Block 2, a subdivision
 of the J B B Davenport headright survey; Thence South 810 yrs to the S E corner of Block 2; Thence
 West 1375 the S W corner of same on the West boundary line of J B B Davenport survey; Thence South
 with said West boundary line 3675 yrs. the Northern N E corner of Pritchett District No 28 where
 the St Louis S W Ry. crosses J B B Davenport survey a corner on Pond Creek under railroad bridge
 across said creek; which is sometimes called the West fork of Glade Creek; Thence down said creek
 the same being the East line of Dist No 28, the general course of which is in a South Easterly di-
 rection 2857 yrs to the Eastern N E corner of District No 28; Thence South with the East line of
 said district 5600 yrs to the original S E corner of District No 28, which is now an el corner of
 District No 29 on the original North boundary line of District No 29; Thence East with the North
 line of District No 29, 3554 yrs to the N E corner of District No 29 in the West line of District
 No 30; Thence North with the West line of J M Stout survey same being the West line of District
 No 30, 2610 yrs to the N W corner of said Stout survey same being a N W corner of District No 30;
 Thence East 1920 yrs to the S E corner of a survey in the name of Robert Burton which is better
 known as the John Mitchell land; Thence North with the East line of said survey at 950 yrs. pass
 the Northern NW corner of District No 30 and the Southern S W corner of District No 22, and at 1900
 yrs. the N E corner of said Burton Survey same being a corner of said District No 22; Thence West
 896 yrs to another corner of District No 22 in the North line of said Burton or John Mitchell land;
 Thence North with the West line of District No 22 at 3500 yrs. another corner of same; Thence West
 160 yrs. another corner; Thence North 1900 yrs. to another corner of said District No 22; Thence
 West 143 yrs to another corner of same; Thence North 1497 yrs to the place of beginning, containing
 surveys and parts of surveys as follows; J B B Davenport, 8618 acres; Robert Burton 320 acres;
 Simpson Brown 836 acres; Malinda Thornton, 327 1/2 acres; A Lumbraro Grant, 239 acres; G W Crow,
 57 1/2 acres; Total 10398 acres or 18.25 square miles.

 of the dividing line known as Jamestown District No 51; and

 District No 51 and returned field notes of said survey;

Therefore in order that the metes and bounds of said district may be more adequately
 defined, at the same time conforming in every respect with the district as established as above
 notes, it is duly considered and ordered that the following field notes be adopted and that said
 District No 51 shall consist of the territory described by said field notes, and the county clerk
 is ordered to enter same of record in the minutes of this court.
