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Court was opened at 10 o'clock A M by proclamation of the sheriff at the court house door, when the following proceedings, among others, were had;

WHEREAS Common School District No 29 of Upshur County Texas was created by general order of the Commissioners Court August 1893; and

WHEREAS said field notes were not placed of record until May 14th, 1903, when a general order of ratification was passed validating all school districts created prior to said date, which said field notes now appear of record in the Commissioners Court Minutes of said County Vol 3 page 298; and

WHEREAS in said record the East boundary line of said district was made with the meanders of Glade Creek; and

WHEREAS said Glade Creek follows closely and crosses many times in its meanders southward to the Sabine River, the East boundary line of the HW Augustine SR survey, and the East Boundary line of the JBB Davenport survey; and

WHEREAS the field notes of Common School District No 30 the record of said field notes being made in Vol 3 page 399 Minutes of the Commissioners Court of said county, in which said record of field notes the West line of said district No 30, which is adjacent to and lies East of said District No 29; and

WHEREAS the calls for said line does not mention Glade Creek but calls for the East Boundary line of the HW Augustine and JBB Davenport surveys; and

WHEREAS this discrepancy appears, and WHEREAS no material conflict appears the same being shown by plats and field notes submitted by the County Surveyor of said Upshur County; and

WHEREAS the Commissioners Court of said Upshur County and the Supt Office of said County, have recognized the headright lines as the true and correct boundary between said districts No 29 and 30; and

WHEREAS Common School District No 30 has already issued bonds for building purposes and its field notes approved; and

WHEREAS the field notes of Common School District No 29 were amended by order of the Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas, which said order appears of record in Vol 4 page 211 under date of Aug 17th 1913;

S F Williams is hereby appointed presiding officer for said election, and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same, and he shall, within five days after said election has been held make due return thereof to the Commissioners' Court of this County, as is required by law for holding a general election.

The ballots for said election shall have printed thereon the following;

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this County, and who are resident property taxpayers in said district shall be entitled to vote at said election.

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In Re redefining Boundaries  
of Soules Chapel Common School  
District No 12.

In Commissioners Court Upshur County Texas.  
March Term 1915, March 8th 1915.

WHEREAS Soules Chapel Common School District No 12 of Upshur County Texas, was regularly created and defined by order of the Commissioners Court in August 1893 by a general order of said court; and

WHEREAS the field notes describing the metes and bounds of said district were not placed of record in Upshur County, Texas, and

WHEREAS on May 14th 1903 the Commissioners Court of said county passed a general order of ratification validating all common school districts in said Upshur County, created prior to that date, and field notes for said Common School District No 12 were placed of record in Vol 3 page 396 Minutes of said Commissioners Court; and

WHEREAS said field notes were amended some time after May 14th 1903, but which said amendment does not appear of record upon the minutes of said Commissioners court; and

WHEREAS said school district in obedience to said amended order of said court relinquished all control and claim to a certain portion of territory which had formerly belonged to said common school district, same being adjacent to and lying South of Caney Creek, said creek having been made the South boundary line by an order of said court, and

WHEREAS said district since the order passed by said court cutting off a portion South of said Caney Creek, has not attempted to exercise control of said territory; and

WHEREAS common school district No 13 has since said time of said amended order exercised supervision and control over the territory cut off of Soules Chapel District No 12; and

WHEREAS the County Supt office and the Commissioners Court of said Upshur County have since the time of said amended order recognized that this territory had been legally cut off from Soules Chapels District No 12, and added on to the territory controlled by Grice Common School District No 13; and

WHEREAS in an election held on the 26th day of Sept 1914, to determine whether bonds of said district No 12 should be issued for the purpose of building a school house within said district in which election none of the voters South of Caney Creek participated in or voted at said election; and

WHEREAS it is desired to redefine the boundaries of Soules Chapel Common School District No 12 with proper metes and bounds in accordance with an order passed some time after May 14th 1903, at which time said District boundaries were amended and redefined; and

WHEREAS it is desired by the Court to fix said boundaries as the said districts were so ordered at said time of amendment and have since been recognized;

It is therefore ordered by the court that Soules Chapel Common School District No 12 of Upshur County Texas be and is hereby redefined with the following field notes made by the County Surveyor, W C Elms, of Upshur County, Texas, and that the same be recorded herewith;

being present, and, among other proceedings had, passed the following order;

WHEREAS, at an election held for the purpose on the 26 day of Sept 1914 a majority of the qualified property tax paying voters of Common School District No 12 of this County, voting at said election, voted in favor of the issuance of the bonds hereinafter described, and in favor of the tax hereinafter levied;

It is, therefore, ordered by the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County that the bonds of said County, to be called "Common School District No 12 School House bonds" be issued on the faith and credit of Common School District No 12 of said County, as established by order of the Commissioners' Court of said County, passed on the 14th day of May 1903, which is of record in the minutes of said court on page 393-5 as amended by subsequent order which is not of record and as redefined without change of recognized

boundaries March 8, 1914, Book 3, page 10, for the purpose of providing funds to be expended in payment of accounts legally contracted in constructing and equipping a public free school building of wooden material and purchasing a site therefore within said district.

Said bonds shall be numbered consecutively from one to 12 inclusive; shall be of the denomination of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each, aggregating Twelve Hundred (\$1200.00) Dollars.

They shall be dated April 10 1915 and shall become due and payable 20 years after date, with option of redemption after 5 years.

They shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable annually on April 10th of each years.

Principal and interest shall be payable upon presentation and surrender of bonds or proper coupons in lawful money of the United States at the County Depository of Upshur County, Gilmer, Texas, or at the State Treasury, Austin, Texas, at the option of the holder.

The said bonds shall be signed by the County Judge, countersigned by the County Clerk and registered by the County Treasurer, and the seal of the Commissioners' Court shall be impressed upon each of them. The fac simile signatures of the County Judge and County Clerk may be lithographed, engraved or printed on the coupons.

It is further ordered by the Court that, to pay interest on said bonds and create a sinking fund sufficient to discharge them at maturity, a tax of and at the rate of 25 cents on each one hundred dollars of the assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation in said common School District No 12 of this County shall be annually levied, assessed and collected upon said property until said bonds, with interest, are paid, and said tax is here now levied for the year 1915.

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COUNTY JUDGE'S ORDER (Dist No 10)

WHEREAS, on the 19th day of December 1914, a petition was presented to me for an election in common school district No 10 of this County on the question of issuing bonds to provide funds to be expended in payment of accounts legally contracted in constructing and equipping a public free school building of wooden material and purchasing a site therefor within said district, and authorizing a tax upon all taxable property within said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity, said petition bearing the requisite number of signatures of property taxpaying voters of said district and being in every respect in conformity with law; and, it appearing that Upshur county contains a population of more than 10,000 according to the last United States Census; and

It further appearing that said Common School District No 10 was, at the August term 1893, established by order of Commissioners' Court of Upshur County Texas, and that field notes and plat of same were made and returned by the County Surveyor of Upshur County, Texas, and that said district No 10 was thereafter recognized as a common

school district, having regularly election trustees and emploted teachers and performed such duties under law as they desired; but, it further appearing to the Commissioners' Court that said original field notes and map of said district No 10 as made and returned had never been recorded in the minutes of said Commissioners' Court prior to May 11th 1903, on which said date it was ordered by Commissioners' Court, Upshur County, Texas "that each and every school district that has been created and field notes of said school district and Nos. that has been organized and heretofore known in said Upshur County as a school district with a number and lines and boundaries run and known, be and are hereby ratified and ordered to be recorded as school districts organized, numbered and known by names and numbers in the said Upshur County and State of Texas."

And it further appearing that from the minutes of the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Vol 3, page 473 that the County Surveyor acting in obedience order of said court, under date of May 14th 1903, prepared and filed with the County Clerk said field notes and the same are therein duly recorded, and it further appearing that the field notes of said Common School Bistrict No 10 were amended Feb 14th 1905, Vol 3 page 492, in May 12, 1908, Vol 4, page 6, and in Oct 18, 1912, Vol 4, page 344, of record *May 31 1910, Vol 4 page 74 June term 1914 Vol 4 page 499-501* in the minutes of said Court; and

It further appearing that said district as so established contains an area of more than nine square miles, and that no other district has been reduced in area below nine square miles by reason of the creation of this district; and,

It further appearing that said district No 10 does not embrace and territory that was taken from any other school district (either common or independent) that had an outstanding issue of bonds at the date of such inclusion in this district;


