

PROCLAMATION OF THE STOCK LAW ELECTION.

STATE OF TEXAS, COUNTY OF UPSHUR.

Whereas the Commissioner's Court of Upshur County, Texas, on the 10th day of December A D 1917, passed and voted for an election to be held within the limits of a subdivision of said Upshur County, hereinafter described to determined whether or not horses, mules, jacks, jennets and cattle should be permitted to run at large within the limits of said sub-division of Upshur County, described as follows, towit: Beginning at the N W corner of Big Sandy Justice Precinct no. 7 of Upshur County Texas, same being on the Upshur-wood County line; thence North with said County line to the Southern Gilmer and Quitran Public Road and where said road crosses said County line; thence Eastwardly with said road as a line to a point in said Public road where same crosses the West boundary line of Gilmer Justice Precinct No. 1, of Upshur County; thence South with said W B line of Precinct No. One to a corner of same; Thence S 15 E with the S W boundary line of said Gilmer Justice Precinct No. One to a N E corner of said Big Sandy Justice Precinct No. 7; Thence West with the N B line of said Justice Precinct No. 7 to the place of beginning.

And thereafter for more than thirty (30) days previous to said election, said order was duly published in the Gilmer Weekly Mirror, a newspaper published in said Upshur County, and whereas said election was on the 15th day of January, 1918 held in and for said subdivision of said County, designated in the said order, in accordance to law and whereas, on the 18th day of January, 1918, the returns of said election were opened and tabulated by the County Judge of said County in the presence of D. Walker, County Clerk of said County, and Henry Mings and W J Brison, reputable citizens of Upshur County.

And whereas it appears from said returns that sixty-one (61) votes were cast, "For the Stock Law" thirty-seven (37) votes were cast, "Against The Stock Law" twenty-four (24) votes were cast.

Now therefore, I, W. H. McClelland, County Judge in and for the said County and State do hereby declare and proclaim that a majority of the votes cast at said election were "FOR THE STOCK LAW" and that the said election has resulted for the Stock Law in and for said subdivision of Upshur County as above described and that after the expiration of thirty (30) days from date hereof it shall be unlawful to permit to run at large any horses, mules, jacks, jennets and cattle within the boundaries of said subdivision of Upshur County, Texas.
