THE FOLLOWING ORDERS WERE PASSED. At November, terms 1918, is is ordere by the court that J. E. Harrell be appointed constable in and for Precenct No 2 Upshur County, Tex. to fill the unexpired term of R. L. Alexander resigned. It is ordered by the court that W. H. Reed be appointed Constable in and for Precent No 8 Upshur County, Texas, to fill out the unexpired term of J. E. Harrel resigned. It is ordered by the Court that J. D. Williams be appointed constable to fill out the unexpired term of Maronn Beago resigned. It is ordered by the Court that Mrs. Darnell be declared a County porper and that she be forced in charge of Mrs. Brooks at County, Home,

It is ordered by the Court, that all purchase for the county, of every kind whatever shall be ordered by County Judge, with O.K. of County Audetor;

It is ordered that the sheriff shall make daily reports to the County auditor, of all prisoners, held in County Jail,

It is ordered by the Court that the County Treasurer shall not receive any money, from any person for deposit without a written permit from the County Clerk, authorizing same, Said Treasurer, shall Counter Sign said order which shall act as a receipt to the person making the deposit.

It is ordered by the Commissioner Court, Dr. J. C. Winn, be, and he is hereby a-pointed, County Health Officer, in and for Upshur County, For 2 Years, Beginning December, 2nd, 1918.

IT IS ORDERED BY THE COURT. That, a contract be intered into with W. H. McClelland, to make a map, of the Road System, of Upshur County, It is agreed that, said map is to be paid for, when approved by the State Highway Comrissioner's, at a price to be determined by the Commissioner's Court, and Said State Highway Commission, jointly.

IT IS ORDERED BY THE COURT: That Mrs. N. A. Brooks, be allowed Eighteen Dollars per month for each County Porper placed in her care, said allowance to begin with the November, term, 1918.

IT IS ORDERED BY THE COURT: That Dr. G. A. Taylor, be allowed Fifteen Dollars, per month for caring for Lue Hall, a County Porper,

IT IS ORDERED BY THE COURT: That the Telephone Bill of Five Dollars per month for the Three Phones now installed in the Court House, shall be paid by the County Clerk, on or before the Fifth day before each month, that the County may get the benefit of the ten per cent discharge,

B. line of said Gilmer Justice precinct No 1. Thence South with said Gilmer Justice Precinct No 1 line to a corner of same; Thence S. W. with the S. E. Boundary line of said Justice Precinct No 1 to another corner of same; Thence West to the place of beginning.

COUNTY JUDGE'S ORDER.

THE STATE OF TEXAS. }
COUNTY OF UPSHUR. }

Whereas, on the 2nd day of September, 1918 a petition was presented to me for an election in Common County Line School District No, 26, of this County, and Wood County, on the question of authorizing a tax of and at the rate of 25 cents on the \$100. valuation of taxable property in said district for the purpose of supplementing the State School Fund apportioned to said district, said petition bearing the requisite number of signatures of property taxpaying voters of said district, and being in every respect in conformity with law; Now, therefore, I W. H. McClelland, in my capacity as County Judge of Upshur County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held on the 28th day of September, 1918, at Shady Grove School House in said Common County Line School District No 26 of this Count, as established by order of the Com issioners's Court of date the 10th day of May, 1918, which is recorded in Book Four pages 67, of the minutes of said Court to determine whether a majority of the legally qualified taxpaying voters of that district desire to tax themselves for the purpose of supplementing the State School Fund apportioned to said district and to determine whether the Commissioner's Court, of this County shall be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually a tax of and at the rate of Twenty Five cents on the \$100.00 valuation of taxable property in said district for said pupsoes. R. A. Mayfied, is hereby appointed presiding officer for said election, and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same and he shall, within five days after said election has been held, make due return thereof, to the Commissioners Court as it required by law for hoding said election. The ballots for said election shall have written or printed thereon the following; "For School Tax", Against School Tax" All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this County, and of Wood County, and who are resident property taxpayers, in said District, shall be entitled to vote. The Sheriff of this County, shall give notice of the election by posting Three Notices of this order in three public places in said Bistrict for three weeks before the election.
