

BE IT REMEMBERED that on the 31 day of July, A.D. 1920, there was begun and holden a Special session of Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas, the following members being present: D. Walker, County Judge; J. L. George, Commissioner Precinct No. 1; Jerry Dean Commissioner precinct No. 2; G. W. McIntosh Commissioner Precinct No. 3; A. W. Tucker Commissioner Precinct No. 4 and G. L. Florence County Attorney; J. W. Bryce, Sheriff; and T. A. Cook, County Clerk when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

In the commissioners court of Upshur County Texas, July 31st 1920.

On this day came on to be considered the matter of the various road contracts and work in which Smith Brothers, general contractors of Crockett, Texas, are engaged in Upshur County, and it appearing to the court that no sale can be had at this time for the Four Hundred and Nine Thousand dollars in road bonds now on hand, and that Upshur County is unable until said bonds or some of them are sold, to pay for said work; And whereas Smith Bros, have refused to accept bonds at par as pay for work already done;

It is therefore deemed advisable and necessary to discontinue for the present the work being done by Smith Brothers on the Public roads of Upshur County.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged, and decreed that no further work be done under said contracts, and that all work involving the paying out of the Million Dollar Bond Issue be and the same is hereby discontinued until said bonds or some of them can be legally sold at par and accrued interest.
