The Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas, at special term on March 3, 1922 finds that J R Melvin, County Judge of Upshur County, Texas, tendered his resignation as County Judge to the Commissioners Court of said County on the 27th day of February, 1922 and that said commissioners court accepted his resignation on said date; and that there is a vacancy in said office at this time; that H V Davis, is hereby appointed to fill out the unexpired term of the said J R Melvin, as County Judge of Upshur County, Texas, and that the amount of his official bond be \$2500.00

The commissioners court of Upshur county, Texas, on this 3rd day of March, 1922, find that H V Davis, has taken oath of office as county Judge, of Upshur County, Texas, thereby creating a vacancy in the office of County Attorney, of Upshur County, Texas, and that said office of County attorney is now vacant; that J N Aldridge is hereby appointed County Attorney of Upshur County, Texas, to fill out the unexpired term of H V Davis.

Whereas, at an election held for the purpose on the 15th day of October, 1921, a majority of the qualified property taxpaying voters of Common School District No. 6, of this county having at said election voted in favor of the issuance of the bonds hereinafter described and in fafor of the tax hereinafter levied;

Therefore be it ordered by the Commissioners Court of Upshur County;

I.

That the bonds of said district to be called "Common School District No. 6, School House bonds" be issued on the faith and credit of said common School District No. 6, of said County, as established by order of the Commissioners Court passed on the 14th day of September, A.D. 1914, which is of record in Book Designated records of Minutes of Commissioners Court on pages Vol. 4, page 558 for the purpose of providing funds to be expended in the payments of accounts legally contracted in constructing and equipping an addition of wooden material to the present public free school building in said district.

II.

Said bonds shall be numbered consecutively from one to 8 inclusive, shall be of the denomination of \$100.00 each, aggregating \$800.00.

It is hereby ordered that \$7.35 be paid to T A Culberson out of Enon School Fund, because of payment to wrong school district.

It is hereby ordered that the pay of Tick Inspectors, \$75.00 per month, be stopped.

It is ordered that the valuation of the J H Cunliff estate on land in Jacob Lagrone, R Asher, A Butler, Geo. Maxtin and R M Wadkins surveys be lowered to \$5.00 per acre, for the year 1921.

It is hereby ordered that the following officers exofficio be changed as follows:

- County Judge.....from \$1300.00 to \$1200.00 per year.
- County Clerk.....from 600.00 to 250.00 per year.
- Sherifffrom 1000.00 to 250.00 per year
- District Clerk to remain at \$200.00 per year.

County Treasurer for receiving all moneys other than school funds, for County, one eighth of one per cent, and one eighth of one per cent for paying out the same . The County Clerk is hereby ordered to issue warrants at the end of each quarter.

It is hereby ordered that the county Clerk issue warrants to B F Haney for keeping Peter Jones, Pauper, twice per month at one dollar per day beginning March 1, 1922.

It is hereby ordered that the County Judge be purchasing agent for Upshur County, and that anything bought other than by the County Judge will not be paid for by the County

It is hereby ordered by the commissioners Court that county clerk issue warrants to Mrs L W Martin, pauper allowance, for \$20.00 per mo. warrants to be turned over to J G Glover for Mrs Martin.

It is hereby ordered by the Commissioners Court in regular session that Upshur County pay Three men \$65.00 per month as inspectors for a period of 3 months if necessary, and allow \$140.00 for incidental expense in cleaning and refilling and repairing dipping vats and furnish cattle tick dip, in putting on the tick eradication work and that County Judge purchase 1000 gallons of dip.
