

BE IT REMEMBERED that on the 9th day of April, A.D. 1923 there was begun and holden a regular session of the Commissioners court of Upshur County, Texas, the following members being present: S J Moughon County Judge, J B Woodfin, Commissioner Precinct No. 1; A A Harrison, Commissioner Precinct No. 2; J R Hinson, Commissioner Precinct No. 3; L A Richardson, Commissioner Precinct No. 4, G L Florence, County Attorney, J W Bryce, Sheriff, and Ramah Oliver, County Clerk when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

It is ordered by the court that corrections be made in Latch School District bond issue papers as per recommendation of Attorney General of the State.

It is ordered by the court that money collected by County in the Maggie Houston tax delinquent case in which said land was purchased by H V Davis, be returned to H V Davis because said land was not delinquent as shown by land owners tax receipts.

It is ordered by the court that the taxes against Glezen Lumber-Company be cancelled as the tax had been paid by T H Glezen.

It is ordered by the Commissioners court that 32½ acres of land on abstract No. 278 J Lagrone belonging to Mrs M C Dyer be reduced from \$325.00 to \$215.00 ; that 44 8/10 acres on No. 5 M N Pulvador belonging to H B Dagnell be reduced from \$10.00 per acre to \$8.00 per acre. That 137 acres on No. 288 Jno Long belonging to E Shrum be reduced from \$1370.00 to \$800.00

It is ordered by the court that taxes of Frank Parker for the nine years running from 1914 to 1922 inclusive aggregating \$145.50 be reduced to \$108.72 for the said years.

It is ordered by the commissioners court in open session this the 10 day of April, 1923, that the County Treasurer pay to the Seaboard National Bank of New York N Y the interest due on 807 Upshur County road bonds due May 15th, 1923, also that he pay off and retire five of said bonds Nos 3 to 7 inclusive of Series D and the County Clerk is ordered to issue to said County treasurer County warrants to cover the amount of said interest and bonds.

It is ordered by the commissioners court that J C Humphreys be refunded half the taxes on 100 acres of land owned and rendered by M B Brewer also 50 acres was rendered by J C Humphreys half of the County taxes on the land amounte to \$18.65.

In the matter of shipping cattle out of Upshur County, it is the sense of the Commissioners court that we cannot entertain proposition of partnership with other counties nor put on a regular inspector at a salary and we also defer buying any cattle dip for the present.

whereas, the Commissioners court of this County on 9/24/21 issued \$25,000.00, 8% interest bearing warrants or bonds against the Common County fund due and payable as follows: to-wit: April 1st, & Oct 1st, of each year.

And on 9/24/21, \$21,000.00 8% interest bearing warrants or bonds against the road and Bridge fund due and payable as follows, to-wit: April 1st, & Oct 1st of each year.

And on 10/15/1921, \$15,000.00 8% interest bearing warrants or bonds against the Road & Bridgefund due & payable as follows, to-wit: April 1st, & Oct 1st, of each year.

And whereas said warrants are illegal and void and whereas, the County never received the amount for which said warrants were issued now therefore be it ordered that this court here & now repudiates said warrants. But whereas, the County has no desire to refuse to pay any just debt that it owes, be it ordered, That the county is willing to pay & here now offers to pay the amount the County actually received for said warrants with 6% interest per annum thereof, while the transaction in which said warrants or bonds were issued & saidt purport that the County received the full amount of said warrants or bonds, such is not the fact, the county only received 87½ cents on the dollar therefor & we are willing to pay said amount with 6% interest per annum, thereon.

The County Clerk is here authorized to notify the warrant or bond holders of this order.
