WHEREAS, on the 16th day of May, A. D. 1919, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County enacted an order authorizing and directing the issuance of the bonds of said County in the amount of \$22,500.00 for the purpose of purchasing or taking over the improved roads already constructed in road district No 4, of said County, and authorizing and directing the issuance of other bonds in said order described: and,

WHEREAS, in said order the bonds of said County proposed and authorized to be issued for the purpose of purchasing and taking over the improved roads of said road district No 4 of said County were correctly described as to the amount of the proposed issue, to-wit: \$22,500.00 but were incorrectly described as to the number of said bonds outstanding and unpaid; the outstanding and unpaid bonds of said road district No 4 being Nos three (3) to forty-seven (47) inclusive, bonds Nos. one (1) to two (2) of said series for \$500.00 each having been paid on the date of their maturity, to-wit: January 1st. 1919, and the purpose of this order is to properly describe the bonds proposed to be issued, and to issue same in accordance with Chapter 38, Second Called Session of the 36th Legislature, 1919 amendatory of Chapter 203, general laws of the Regular Session of the 35th Legislature 1917.

THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED, that said order of this court of date May 16th 1919, in so far as it affects the issuance of the bonds of said County for the purpose of purchasing or taking over the improved roads already constructed in road district No 4, be and the same is hereby amended so that same shall hereafter read as follows:

WHEREAS, at an election held for the purpose on the 26th day of April 1919, a two thirds majority of the resident property tax payers who are qualified voters of Upshur County Texas voting at said election, voted in favor of the proposition to issue said bonds for the purpose of purchasing or taking over the improved roads already constructed in road district No 4. of said Upshur County, Texas, and the levy of a tax in payment therefor, by a vote of 1905 for and 719 against the proposition to issue said bonds.

THEREFORE, IT IS FURTHER ORDERED by the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas:

1. That Upshur county Special road Bonds to be called "UPSHUR COUNTY SPECIAL ROAD BONDS", be issued on the faith and credit of said County under and by virtue of the constitution and laws of the State of Texas, including an act of the regular session of the 35th Legislature, the same being articles 637a, 637b and 637c of Section 2, Chapter 203, Acts of 1917 as amended by Chapter 38, Acts of Second Called Session of the 26th Legislature 1919.
