It is ordered by the Court that Mrs. M.E. Silvers be declared a pauper and the Co Clerk is ordered to issue a warrant the 1st day of each month for \$12.00 on General Fund same to begin October 1, 1932.

It is ordered by the Court that Mrs. John Howell has been declared a pauper and the Co Clerk is authorized to issue Check on Gen. Fund for \$4.00 per month payable the 1st day of each Mo.

It is ordered by the Court that Co. Clerk issue Warrant on General Fund to K.E. Daily for \$25.00 as part payment on transporting Lucidean Daily to Sanatorium.

It is ordered by the Commissioners Court that the Auto Fund be divided in 4 funds known as Auto # 1, 2, 3 & 4, respectively according to precincts & the following funds be transferred as follow: From Auto to Auto # One, \$2794.91; From Auto to Auto # Two \$2087.57 from Auto to Auto # Three: None, From Auto to Auto # Four \$2860.92

IN THE MATTER OF FIXING THE TAX RATE FOR UPSHUR COUNTY FOR THE YEAR.

On this the 12th day of September A.D. 1932, came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas, the question of fixing the Tax Rate on each \$100 valuation of all of the taxable property of Upshur County, Texas, subject to taxation on the first day of January A.D. 1932. And the Commissioners Court being of the opinion that a levy of 50 cents on the \$100 valuation of all taxable property in Upshur County, Texas on the first day of January A.D. 1932 will be sufficient to meet the demand of the County for the current year. It is therefore considered and ordered by the Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas, in a regular session on this the 17th day of September A.D. 1932 all members of said Court being present, to-wit:

That an advalorem tax of and at the rate of 50 cents on a \$100 valuation of all taxable property in Upshur County, Texas, on the first day of January A.D. 1932, be and the same is hereby levied in lawful currency of U.S. of America for the following purposes and apportioned to the following funds of Upshur County, Texas, to-wit:

For General purposes an advalorem tax of and at the rate of 25 cents on the \$100 valuation of all taxable property in Upshur County, Texas, on January 1st 1932, A.D. is hereby levied. Of the 25 cents for general purposes, 3 cents is set aside to take care of certain outstanding warrants heretofore issued, leaving 22 cents available for general purposes.

For Road and Bridge purposes that is for building public roads and bridges and keeping same in repair, an advalorem tax of and at the rate of 15 cents on each \$100 valuation of taxable property, in Upshur County Texas, on the 1st day of January A.D. 1932, is hereby levied. Of the 15 cents Road and Bridge Tax herein levied 3 cents is set aside to take care of certain outstanding warrants heretofore issued.

For the purpose of paying the Jurors in District, County and Justice Courts in Upshur County, Texas, an advalorem tax of and at the rate of 3 cents on the \$100 valuation of all taxable property in Upshur County, Texas, on the 1st day of January A.D. 1932, is hereby levied.

For the purpose of maintaining, improving, furnishing and keeping in repair the Court House and Jail and for other improvements an advalorem tax of and at the rate of 7 cents on

the \$100 valuation of taxable property in Upshur County, Texas on the 1st day of January A.D. 1932 is hereby levied.

And it is further ordered by the Court that one-half of the amount levied by the State of Texas upon all occupation tax be and the same is hereby levied for the purpose of supplementing the Jury fund of Upshur County, Texas, and that a per capita tax of 25 cents be levied on all persons living in Upshur County, Texas on the 1st day of January A.D. 1932 subject to Poll Tax.

For the purpose of supplementing the Road and Bridge fund a special advalorem tax of 15 cents on the \$100 valuation of all taxable property in Upshur County, Texas, on the 1st day of January A.D. 1932, is hereby levied.

It is further ordered by the Court that to pay the interest on the Bonding indebtedness and create a sinking fund sufficient to re-deem the Bonds at their maturity a special of and at the rate of \$1.00 on the \$100 valuation of all taxable property, in Upshur County, Texas, on the 1st day of January A.D. 1932 is hereby levied.

It is ordered by the Court that the following amount of taxes on the \$100 valuation of all taxable property on the 1st day of January A.D. 1932 be levied for School purposes in the various Districts as set out below:
