WHEREAS, on the 20th day September 1932, a petition was presented to me for an election in East Mountain Common School District No. 31, of this County on the question of issuing Bonds for the purpose of (a) Constructing and equipping a public free school building of brick material in said district and authorizing a tax upon all taxable property within said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity, said petition bearing the requisite number of signatures of property taxpaying voters of said district and being in every respect in conformity with law; and, it appearing that Upshur County, contains a population of _____ according to the last United States Census, and

It further appearing that said East Mountain Common School District No. 31 has been heretofore properly established; and

It further appearing that said district as so established contains an area of nine square miles, and that no other district has been reduced in area below nine square miles by reason of the creation of this district; and (b) that Upshur County contains more than Ten Thousand people.

It further appearing that said District No. 31 does not embrace any territory that was taken from any other school district (either common or independent), that had an outstanding issue of bonds at the date of such inclusion in this district except as follows, to-wit: None

Now, Therefore, I, Gus Morris, in my capacity as county judge of Upshur County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held on (c) 17th day of October 1932 at (d) the school house in said East Mountain Common School District No. 31, of this county, to determine whether a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters of that district desire

the issuance of bonds on the faith and credit of said common school district in the amount of \$30,000.00 the bonds to be of the denomination of \$1,000.00 each numbered consecutively from one to 30, both inclusive, payable serially as follows, to-wit:

\$15,000.00 Dollars on the 1st day of April 1933. and

\$15,000.00 Dollars on the 1st day of April 1934, and bearing five per cent interest per annum, for the purpose of (e) constructing and equipping a public free school building of brick material in said district and to determine whether the Commissioners Court of this County shall be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually while said bonds or any of them are outstanding, a tax upon all taxable property within said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity.

J.B. Webb is hereby appointed presiding officer for said election, and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same, and he shall, within five days after said election has been held, make due return thereof to the Commissioners' Court of this County, as is required by law for holding a general election.

The ballots for said election shall have written or printed thereon the following:

"For the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

"Against the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

All persons who are legal qualified voters of this State and of this County and who are resident property taxpayers in said district shall be entitled to vote at said election.

The Sheriff of this County Shall give notice of said election by posting three notices in three public places in the said district for three weeks before the election.

AN ORDER

By the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, amended a certain order of said Court, dated November 14, 1932, authorizing the issuance of \$30,000.00 bonds by East Mountain Common School District #31, bearing five per cent interest, and levying a tax to pay the principal and interest thereof, and amending Section 9 of said order passed on November 14, 1932.

WHEREAS, at an election held for that purpose on the 17th day of October 1932, a majority of the qualified property taxpaying voters of East Mountain Common School District #31 of Upshur County, Texas, voted in favor of the issuance of \$30,000 bonds bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum; said bonds to mature serially, \$15,000 during the years 1933
