On this the 28th day of November, A.D. 1932, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, convened in regular session at a special term thereof at the Court house in the City of Gilmer, with the following members of the Court present, to-wit:

Commissioners' Court,

being present, constituting the entire court, at which time the following, among other proceedings, was had:

Commissioner Cobb introduced a proposed order and made a motion that it be passed. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Robinson. The motion carried by the following Vote:  
Ayes: Commissioners Cobb, Robinson, Thompson and Hart; Nones: None.

The Judge announced that the order had been passed. The order as passed is as follows, to-wit:

AN ORDER

By the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, amended a certain order of said Court, dated November 14, 1932, authorizing the issuance of \$30,000.00 bonds by East Mountain Common School District #31, bearing five per cent interest, and levying a tax to pay the principal and interest thereof, and amending Section 9 of said order passed on November 14, 1932.

WHEREAS, at an election held for that purpose on the 17th day of October 1932, a majority of the qualified property taxpaying voters of East Mountain Common School District #31 of Upshur County, Texas, voted in favor of the issuance of \$30,000 bonds bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum; said bonds to mature serially, \$15,000 during the years 1933

and 1934, respectively; and

WHEREAS, on the 14th day of November 1932, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, in regular session, authorized the issuance of said bonds and levied a tax therefor; and

WHEREAS, it appearing to the Court that it would be to the best interest of said school district to amend said order by amending Section 9 thereof;

THEREFORE, Be it ordered by the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County,

I.

That Section 9 of the order dated November 14, 1932, levying taxes at the rate of One Dollar (\$1.00) on the One Hundred Dollar (\$100.00) valuation of taxable property for the purpose of paying the interest and creating a sinking fund for the payment of the principal of such bonds, be and the same is hereby amended so as to hereafter read as follows:

SECTION IX.

It is further ordered by the Court that to pay the interest on said bonds and create a sinking fund sufficient to discharge them at maturity, a tax of and at the rate of fifty (50%) cents on each One Hundred Dollar (\$100.00) valuation of all property subject to taxation in said East Mountain Common School District No. 31, of said County, shall be annually levied, assessed and collected upon said property until said bonds with all interest thereon are paid, and said tax of fifty (50%) cents is here now levied for the year 1932, and the same shall be assessed, collected and applied to the purpose named, and for the year 1933 a tax of and at the rate of fifty (50%) cents on each One Hundred Dollar (\$100.00) valuation or so much thereof as may be necessary is hereby levied, ordered to be levied, assessed and collected, which shall be applied to the purpose named.

On this the 12th day of September A.D. 1932, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County was convened in regular session with the County Judge and all of the County Commissioners and the County Clerk present; when, among other business transacted, the following order was passed; to-wit:

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, has heretofore determined the advisability and necessity for the purpose of a Road Tractor and has caused to be published a notice of the time and place, when and where the contract for the purchase of said Road Tractor would be awarded upon Competitive bids, and

WHEREAS, said notice was published in the Gilmer Daily Mirror, a newspaper published in Gilmer, Texas, in said County, which notice was published once a week for two successive weeks prior to date set for letting such contract for said machinery to-wit: August 30th and September 6th 1932, which notice reads as follows:

"NOTICE TO BIDDERS"

The Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, will receive bids at Gilmer, Texas, on September 12th 1932, for the purchase of one or more Approximately 35 H.P Road Tractors "Caterpillar" Type. It is the intention of the Commissioners Court to issue time Warrants in part payment thereof not to exceed \$2,900.00 to bear interest at 6 per cent per annum with maximum maturity date February 15th 1936.
