The Commissioners Court met in Special session with the following present;
Commissioners Cobb, Robinson, Davis and Holmes.

Motion made by Commissioner Cobb and Seconded by Commissioner Holmes, that County Clerk issue warrant on general fund for \$13.00 to C.S. Holyfield for keeping J.W. Franklin pauper and \$20.00 per month hereafter, Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Robinson that W.C. Fowler, be awarded contract to repair the inside wall of the jail with 5 inch reinforced steel concrete bonded to present wall, at an expenditure of \$90.00 to the County Also for material and painting the eaves and front porch overhead, for \$8.00 The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cobb, and carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Cobb and seconded by Commissioner Holmes, that W.C. Fowler place 15 cots in the County jail at \$11.35 each, Motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Robinson that Precinct Two purchase one-fourth acre of gravel from Aaron Walker for \$25.00 to be paid from Auto 2, fund the motion was seconded by Commissioner Cobb, Motion carried.

It appearing to the Court that the Reconstruction Finance Corporation has on hand certain funds that they desire to expend in the various Commissioner's precincts in Upshur County, and it being shown to the Court that said Committee desires the services of the County Agent for one year further; and said Committee promises five thousand dollars to be expended in Upshur County on labor, or for paupers as the Commissioners' Court may see fit, provided, the Upshur County Commissioner's Court should hire said County agent for twelve months. After being discussed by the Court in consideration of said promise by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Committee in Gilmer, a motion was made by Commissioner Davis and seconded by Commissioner Holmes that the County agent be hired for twelve months beginning May 1st 1933 and continuing through April 30, 1934 at a salary of One thousand dollars for said twelve months services. Motion carried, Commissioners Davis, Robinson and Holmes voting aye and Commissioner Cobb voting No.

APRIL 10, 1933

The Commissioners Court met in regular session Monday April 10, 1933.

In Regular Session Monday April 10, 1933, with the following present: J.R. Hinson, Co. Judge, E.A. Cobb, M.F. Robinson, J.P. Davis, and M.O. Holmes, Commissioners.

Motion made and seconded that County Clerk issue Warrant for One Dollar to each holder of election Warrants in School Trustee Elections held April 1st 1933, in Common School Districts, and two dollars to each holder of trustee elections in Consolidated school districts Motion carried.

Motion made and seconded that the Court accept the contract work done by W.C. Fowler on the Upshur County Jail, also approving the buying and installing of one additional cot, and one dollar expenses on the repairs. The total amount the County Clerk's ordered and authorized to issue Warrant to the said W.C. Fowler is \$905.76. Motion carried.

Motion made and carried that the Big Sandy Oil and Refining Co., be permitted to place a pipe line under the public road running from Pineda to Seven Pines, at a point about one mile East of the O'Byrne Home Place, Motion carried three to one, Commissioners Robinson, Davis and Holmes for the motion and Commissioner Cobb, against.

The returns from the various School Trustee elections in the County were canvassed, and after a motion duly made and seconded, the following were declared elected:
