The Commissioners' Court met in regular session with the following present: J. R. Hinson, Co. Judge; E. A. Cobb, M.F. Robinson, J. P. Davis, and M. O. Holmes, Commissioners.

It is ordered by the Court that the sum of \$425.00 be transferred from Auto 1 Fund to Auto 2 Fund, to be used by Auto 2, Fund towards payment of account with J.D. Adams Company on grader, and Precinct No. 2, becomes liable for all the balance due on said account.

It is ordered by the Court that the Co. Clerk issue warrant on General fund to Molly Mayfield, for \$5.00 per month, beginning Aug. 14th she being declared a pauper.

It is ordered by the Court that the Co. Clerk issue Warrant on General Fund to Roger Melton for \$3.00 per month beginning Sept. 1st 1933 he being declared a pauper.

It is ordered by the Court that the Co. Clerk issue Warrant on General fund to C. W. Keal, for \$5.00 per month beginning Aug 14, he being declared a pauper.

Motion made by Commissioner Cobb, that the Highway Commission be requested to construct Highway #155, East from Gilmer as nearly as possible along the present road, and that the Commissioner's Court approve the petition signed by Citizens requesting such change in the road, Motion seconded by Commissioner Holmes and carried, unanimously.

Motion made by Commissioner Holmes that Co. Clerk issue Warrant on General Fund to M.C. Florence for \$25.00 for burial expense of Lela Keed who died Aug 4th Motion was duly seconded and carried.

Motion made, seconded and carried that the Board of Equalization adjourn for the year.

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS' COURT,
UPSHUR COUNTY, Texas.

GENTLEMEN:

As provided by Article 689-A, Revised Civil Statutes of the State of Texas, I am submitting herewith the budget for the County government, covering proposed appropriations and estimated revenues for the ensuing year, together with the estimated rate of tax to be levied, and the County's financial statement.

You will note that the budget contains the following:

All outstanding obligations of the County, which is shown in the space set aside to the particular fund; the cash on hand to the credit of each and every fund of the County Government, which is shown at the top of the page set aside to each fund; the funds received from all sources during the year from August 1, 1932 to July 31, 1933; The funds available from all sources during the ensuing year; The estimated revenues available to cover the proposed budget; using a 75% collection of taxes for the ensuing year; and the estimated rate of tax which will be required.

The estimated revenue for the following budget is based on an estimated assessed valuation of \$16,000,000.00. The total tax rate used is \$1.65 which is itemized as follows:

The revision of the tax rate as itemized above is recommended for your adoption. The special road fund tax is 15¢ each year, because of a vote of the people of Upshur County. Of the 25¢ allotted the general fund, 2¢ is set aside for the general interest and sinking fund. Of the 15¢ allotted to the Road and Bridge fund, 3¢ is set aside for the Road and Bridge Bond Fund.

You will note that the proposed tax rate is 20¢ larger for the proposed budget than for 1932. The reason for the increase, as made to the Jury Fund, and Court House and Jail fund is because of the over-draft accumulated during the year 1932. The reason for the overdraft on

the Jury fund is because another District Court has been in operation in Upshur County for 30 weeks in 1933, and will operate in 1934 for 30 weeks. The reason for the overdraft in the Court House and Jail funds, is because of emergency expenditures not expected at the time the 1933 budget was prepared. In addition to the foregoing reasons, the Tax Collector's department of Upshur County has only been able to collect about 55% of the taxes for the year 1932.

In the proposed budget, there will be found a column showing expenditures from August 1, 1932, to July 31, 1933. In the Road and Bridge Fund and Special Road funds and the various Auto Funds, the proposed Budget for each item for 1933 is not shown, because the budget as adopted for 1933 shows one total of \$75,000.00 for all road purposes, and is not itemized. In the County Bond fund, the budget shows a column for the payment of certain Bonds that should have been met with a Sinking fund requirement in past years. This requirement has not been paid and an appropriation is made for part of this as it affects each issue of outstanding obligations in the County Bond fund.

GENTLEMEN:

As provided by Article 689-A, Revised Civil Statutes of the State of Texas, I am submitting herewith the budget for the County government, covering proposed appropriations and estimated revenues for the ensuing year, together with the estimated rate of tax to be levied, and the County's financial statement.

You will note that the budget contains the following:

All outstanding obligations of the County, which is shown in the space set aside to the particular fund; the cash on hand to the credit of each and every fund of the County Government, which is shown at the top of the page set aside to each fund; the funds received from all sources during the year from August 1, 1932 to July 31, 1933; The funds available from all sources during the ensuing year; The estimated revenues available to cover the proposed budget; using a 75% collection of taxes for the ensuing year; and the estimated rate of tax which will be required.

The estimated revenue for the following budget is based on an estimated assessed valuation of \$16,000,000.00. The total tax rate used is \$1.85 which is itemized as follows:

The revision of the tax rate as itemized above is recommended for your adoption. The special road fund tax is 15¢ each year, because of a vote of the people of Upshur County. Of the 25¢ allotted the general fund, 2¢ is set aside for the general interest and sinking fund. Of the 15¢ allotted to the Road and Bridge fund, 3¢ is set aside for the Road and Bridge Bond Fund.

You will note that the proposed tax rate is 20¢ larger for the proposed budget than for 1932. The reason for the increase, as made to the Jury Fund, and Court House and Jail fund is because of the over-draft accumulated during the year 1933. The reason for the overdraft on
