Commissioner Cobb introduced an order and made a Motion that it be passed.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Robinson. The motion carrying with it the passage of the order prevailed by the following Vote;

THE County Judge announced that the order had been finally passed. The order as

passed is as follows:

AN ORDER  
BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF  
UPSHUR COUNTY EXERCISING THE OPTION TO REDEEM  
CERTAIN ROAD BONDS, AND PROVIDING FOR NOTICE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, did on the 16th day of May 1919, pursuant to an election held and carried in accordance with law, pass an order authorizing the issuance of \$300,000.00 Upshur County Road Bonds, Series "D" dated March 15, 1919 bearing 5½% interest due May 15, 1959, with an option of prior payment retained in said order and in the bonds in substantially the following words:

"Upshur County reserves the right to redeem this Bond on \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 19\_\_\_\_ by paying the principal and accrued interest and in case it shall be called in for redemption before maturity notice thereof in writing shall be given by the County Treasurer of Upshur County, Texas, to the Seaboard National Bank, New York, City New York, at least thirty (30) days before the date fixed for redemption, and if this Bond shall not then be presented it shall cease to bear interest from and after the date so fixed for redemption."

and

WHEREAS, Said Commissioners' Court did on May 10, 1920 pursuant to an election held and carried in accordance with law, pass an order authorizing the issuance of \$200,000.00 Upshur County Road Bonds, Series E, dated May 15, 1920, bearing 5½% interest due May 15, 1960, with an option of prucor payment retained in said order and in the bonds in substantially the following words:

"Said Upshur County, Texas, reserves the right of redeeming this bond on the \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 19\_\_\_\_ by paying principal and accrued interest, and in case the same shall be called in for redemption before maturity, notice thereof, in writing, shall be given to the holder or holders thereof by the County Treasurer of said County at least Thirty days before the date fixed for redemption, and should this bond not be presented for redemption and should this bond not be presented for redemption, the same shall cease to bear interest from and after the date so fixed for redemption."

and,

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court did on the 14th day of June 1920, pursuant to an election held and carried in accordance with law, pass an order authorizing the issuance of \$309,000.00 Upshur County Road Bonds, Series F dated June 15, 1920, bearing 5½% interest due June 15, 1960, with an option of prior payment retained in said order and in the bonds in substantially the following words:

"Said Upshur County, Texas, reserves the right of redeeming this bond on the \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 19\_\_\_\_ by paying principal and accrued interest and in case the same shall be called in for redemption before maturity notice thereof, in writing, shall be given to the holder or holders thereof by the County Treasurer of said County at least thirty days before the date fixed for redemption and should this bond not be presented for redemption the same shall cease to bear interest from and after the date so fixed for redemption"

and

WHEREAS, of said bonds heretofore issued and delivered in accordance with laws, there remain outstanding the following described bonds of said respective issues, concerning which the County now has an option to redeem same at a price of par and accrued interest, to-wit

(a) Series "D" Bonds, numbered 28, 30, 31, 33 to 55 incl. for \$1000.00 each, aggregating \$26,000.00 maturing May 15, 1959;

(b) Series E Bonds, numbered 21, 23, 25, 27 to 30 incl. 32, 34, 36 to 70 incl for \$1000.00 each aggregating \$44,000.00 maturing May 15, 1960;

(c) Series F Bonds, numbered 26, 27, 33 to 35 incl. 43,44,49 to 61 incl. 73 to 104 incl., 107 to 112, incl. for \$1000.00 each aggregating \$58,000.00 maturing June 15, 1960; and

WHEREAS, it is considered to be to the best interest of the County that said bonds be called for redemption.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS:

1. That the following described bonds are hereby called for redemption, the date of redemption being fixed on the 1 day of Oct 1934;

Upshur County Road bonds, Series D, dated March 15, 1919 bearing 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ % interest, being numbers 28-30-31 and 33 to 55 inclusive for \$1000.00 each aggregating \$26,000.00 maturing May 15, 1959.

2. That the following described bonds are hereby called for redemption, the date of redemption being fixed on the 1 day of Oct 1934;

Upshur County Road Bonds, Series E, dated May 15, 1920 bearing 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ % interest being numbers 21, 23,25,27 to 30, inclusive 32,34, and 36 to 70, inclusive for \$1000.00 each aggregating \$44,000.00 maturing May 15, 1960.

3. That the following described bonds are hereby called for redemption, the date of redemption being fixed on the 1 day of Oct 1934;

Upshur County Road Bonds, Series "F" dated June 16, 1920, bearing 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ % interest being numbers 26, 27, 33 to 35 inclusive 43,44, 49 to 61 inclusive 73 to 104, inclusive and 107 to 112 inclusive for \$1000.00 each, aggregating \$58,000.00 maturing June 15, 1960.

4. Funds will be available at the Mercantile National Bank at Dallas, Texas, to pay for said bonds and accrued interest on the dates named. In the event said bonds are not presented for redemption they shall thereafter cease to bear interest from and after the dates so fixed for redemption.

5. The Treasurer of the County is hereby directed to give notice in writing to the Chase National Bank, New York City, New York, successor to the Seaboard National Bank, New York City, New York, at least for a period of thirty days preceding the respective dates fixed for redemption.

6. The County Judge, County Clerk and County Treasurer are hereby directed to do any and all things necessary and/or convenient to carry out the provisions of this order.

Upshur County agrees however, in addition to the Eighty Eight and 50/100 (\$88.50) Dollars to pay doctor Bill to Drs. Ragland and Ragland of Gilmer, Texas, in the sum of Seventeen (\$17.00) Dollars and for further consideration I hereby bind myself, my heirs and legal representatives to forever hold Upshur County Texas harmless from any further claim by reason of said accident or injury.
