COUNTY DEPOSITORY PLEDGE CONTRACT TO COVER SCHOOL FUNDS.

THE STATE OF TEXAS, |
COUNTY OF UPSHUR | KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That First National Bank of Gilmer, Upshur County, Texas, does hereby pledge and deposit the following securities with the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, in the amount of Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00) Dollars upon the terms and conditions and for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Description including Serial Numbers. U.S. Bonds Held in First National Bank, Dallas, Texas.
Rate. 3 1/8. Date of Maturity: 46-49. Amount \$20,000.00

Signed, sealed and dated this the 3 day of August A.D. 1935.

The conditions of the above contract are such that, whereas, the above bounded pledgor First National Bank was on the 11 day of February, A.D. 1935, duly and legally chosen by the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, as County Depository including the school funds for said county for a period of two years ending sixty days from the time fixed by law for the next selection of a depository, upon its bidding and agreeing to pay the County of Upshur interest on daily balances kept in said depository of said County of Upshur at the rate of 1 1/2 per cent per annum, said interest payable monthly.

NOW, THEREFORE, if the above bounden pledgor First National Bank shall faithfully do and perform all the duties and obligations devolving on it by law as the County depository of Upshur County, and shall upon presentation pay checks drawn on it by competent authority, shall faithfully keep and account for all school funds of the County which are deposited with it under the requirements of Chapter 2, Title 47, Revised Civil Statutes 1925, and shall pay the interest at the time and at the rate hereinbefore stipulated, and shall, at the expiration of the term for which it has been chosen, turn over to its successors all the funds, property, and other things of value, coming into its hands as depository, then and in that event this contract is to be and become null and void and the securities above shall be returned to the pledgor, otherwise to remain in full force and effect, hereby specially authorizing the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, to sell at public or private sale, with or without notice to the pledgor, the securities, or any part thereof, and apply the proceeds of sale to the satisfaction of any indebtedness arising by virtue of the violation of any or all the conditions of this contract.

The above provisions is given in addition to any remedy the pledge may have in any suit brought on this contract in any court in this State.

Any suit arising out of or in any way connected with this contract, shall be tried in the County of Upshur and State of Texas in any Court therein having jurisdiction of the subject matter thereof.
