Whereas, on the 20 day of March 1936, a petition was presented to me for an election in Concord Common School District No. 10 of this County on the question of issuing bonds for the purpose of (a) Reconstructing and equipping the Public Free School Building and authorizing a tax upon all taxable property within said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity, said petition bearing the requisite number of signatures of property taxpaying voters of said district and being in every respect in conformity with law; and, it appearing that Upshur County, contains a population of 25,000 according to the last United States Census; and

It further appearing that said Concord Common School District No. 10 has been heretofore properly established; and

It further appearing that said district as so established contains an area of 12 1/2 square miles, and that no other district has been reduced in area below nine square miles by reason of the creation of this district; and (b) . . .

It further appearing that said District No. 10 does not embrace any territory that was taken from any other school district (either common or independent), that had an outstanding issue of bonds at the date of such inclusion in this district except as follows, to-wit: none

Now, therefore, I, J.R. Hinson, in my capacity as county judge of Upshur County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held on (c) 11 day of April 1936, at (d) Concord School House in said Concord Common School District No. 10 of this County, to determine whether a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters of that district desire the issuance of bonds on the faith and credit of said common school district in the amount of \$1000.00 the bonds to be of the denomination of \$100.00 each, numbered consecutively from one to 10, both inclusive, payable serially as follows, to-wit:

\$100.00 dollars on the 1st day of May 1937, and \$100.00 dollars on the 1st day of May each and every year thereafter to and including the year 1946, and bearing 5% per cent interest per annum, for the purpose of (e) Reconstructing and equipping a public free school building and to determine whether the Commissioners' Court of this County shall be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually while said bonds or any of them are outstanding, a tax upon all taxable property within said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity.

A.R. Truitt is hereby appointed presiding officer for said election, and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same, and he shall, within five days after said election has been held, make due return thereof to the Commissioners' Court of this County, as is required by law for holding a general election.

The ballots for said election shall have written or printed thereon the following:
"For the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."
"Against the issuance of bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

All persons who are legal qualified voters of this State and of this County and who are resident property taxpayers in said district shall be entitled to vote at said election.

The Sheriff of this County shall give notice of said election by posting three notices in three public places in the said district for three weeks before the election.
