NOTICE OF HEARING ON PETITION FOR THE ISSUANCE OF ROAD BONDS BY ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-A OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS.

TO THE RESIDENT QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-A, of UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, WHO OWN TAXABLE PROPERTY IN SAID DISTRICT AND WHO HAVE DULY RENDERED THE SAME FOR TAXATION AND TO ALL OTHER PERSONS CONCERNED:

TAKE NOTICE that a petition signed by W. L. Smith and more than fifty (50) other persons, resident property taxpaying voters of Road District Number 1-A, of Upshur County, Texas, who own taxable property in said District and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, has heretofore been submitted to the Commissioners' Court of said County, wherein such petitioners pray the Court for an order for an election on the following proposition:

" WHETHER OR NOT the bonds of ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-A, of UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, shall be issued in the total principal sum of NINETY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$90,000.00) for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating a macadamized, graveled or paved road and turnpike, or in aid thereof in said District, and which bonds are to bear interest at the rate of not exceeding THREE PER CENTUM (3%) per annum, and are to be payable at such times as may be deemed most expedient by the Commissioners' Court, but not to exceed (1) One years from the date thereof, and whether or not ad valorem taxes shall be levied on all taxable property within said Road District for the purpose of paying the interest on the said bonds and providing a sinking fund for the redemption or payment thereof at maturity."

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that the boundaries of said ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-A of UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, are described and defined in the order of the Commissioners' Court of said County, passed and entered of record on May 5, 1945, recorded in Volume 9, page 401, et seq., of the Minutes of said Court, creating and establishing such District and defining its boundaries, and such boundaries, as described and defined in the order aforesaid, are as follows, to-wit: BEGINNING at a point where the line between Justice Precinct No. 1 and Justice Precinct No. 5, in Upshur County, Texas, intersects the N B line of the J. Day headright survey, same being in the S B line of a tract of land owned by Roy Harper; THENCE West with the N B line of the J. Days survey to the NW corner of same; THENCE North with the W B line of the M. H. Williams survey to the SE corner of a tract on the M. Del Torres survey in the name of Mrs. Kate Piper; THENCE West with the S B line of said tract and the S B line of a tract in the name of Neil Buie to the S W corner of said Buie tract; THENCE North to the NE corner of a tract in the name of T. Barber in the N B line of the Torres survey; THENCE West with the N B line of the Torres survey to the SE corner of a tract in the name of Joe Hays and the S W corner of a tract on the Flores grant in the name of Addie Simpson, et al; THENCE North to the NE corner of a tract in the name of J.D. Warren in the S B line of a tract in the name of Mrs. C. Anderson; THENCE West to the S W corner of said Anderson tract; THENCE North to the NE corner of a 50 acre tract in the name of J.D. Warren; THENCE West to the North West corner of said Warren to intersect the East line of the Lumbrera survey; THENCE North with the West boundary line of the Flores survey to the SE corner of a tract in the name of J.C. McDonald; THENCE West with the S B line of said McDonald tract to the S W corner of same; THENCE North to the NE corner of the Edd Moody 31.6 acre tract; THENCE West with the North line of same to the NW corner of same; THENCE South to the NE corner of Edd Moody 36.9 acre tract; THENCE West with the N B line of same to a corner of the J.S. Whites tract; THENCE North to NE corner of Colored Church tract; THENCE West with

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the S B line of the McAlpin tract and the N B L of the Colored Church tract and continuing West to the East right of way line of Highway No. 271; THENCE with the East right of way line of said highway in a southerly direction to the S W corner of a tract known as the Herring tract, now owned by J. W. Free; THENCE East with the S B line of said Free tract to the N W corner of a 37-1/4 acre tract in the name of F. L. Putrell, in the A. Lumbrera Grant; THENCE South to the S E corner of a tract in the name of F.D. Putrell; THENCE East to the N W corner of a tract in the name of R. A. Owens; THENCE South to the S E corner of the F.D. Putrell Est. 50 acre tract; THENCE East to the N W corner of the M. Del Torres survey; THENCE South to the S W corner of the Norman McClelland land; THENCE East to the N W corner of the W. D. Barber 128-1/2 acre tract on the Torres survey; THENCE South to the S W corner of the Barber tract; THENCE East to the N E corner of the Douphrate land; THENCE South to the S W corner of the R.C. Barnwell tract in the S B line of the Torres survey; THENCE East to the N E corner of the W. Bratton survey; THENCE South to the N W corner of the R. B. Blalock 85 acre tract and the N W corner of the J. Manning survey; THENCE East with the N B line of said J. Manning survey to a point where the line between Justice Precinct NO. 1 and Justice Precinct No. 5, intersects same; THENCE S 45 W with the line between Justice Precinct No. 1 and Justice Precinct No. 5 to the S E corner of said Justice Precinct No. 1; THENCE West with the South line of Justice Precinct No. 1 to a point where said line intersects the east right of way line of U.S. Highway No. 271; THENCE in a southerly direction with the east right of way line of said U.S. HIGHWAY No. 271 to the point where the line between Upshur and Gregg Counties intersects same; THENCE N 88 E. with the line between Gregg and Upshur Counties to a corner of same; THENCE N 37-30 E with the line between Gregg and Upshur Counties to intersect the Glenwood and Indian Rock School District line; THENCE with the S B L of M. Irvin survey to the Western S W corner of same; THENCE North with the W B L of said M. Irvin survey to the S E corner of J.C. Crouch survey; THENCE West to the S W corner of J.C. Crouch survey; THENCE North along the W B L of said Crouch survey, passing the N W corner of the said survey and continuing North to intersect Bog Creek; THENCE down said creek to where said Bog Creek intersects Clear Creek; THENCE up Clear Creek in a Southwesterly direction to where said creek intersects the line of Justice Precinct No. 1; THENCE S 45 deg W. with said precinct line to the place of beginning.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that said petition has been set down for hearing before the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, on the 4 day of June, 1945, at ten o'clock A.M., the place of such hearing being in the Commissioners' Court Room in the Courthouse of said County at Gilmer, Texas.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that the aforesaid petition stipulates and provides that if the said bonds are voted and issued the money received from the sale thereof will be applied to constructions, maintaining and operating that certain road within the said District known as "GILMER-GLENWOOD ROAD", which Road runs in a southeasterly direction from the old Colored Orphanage to intersect Justice Precinct Number 1 and Justice Precinct Number 5, at the Old Bruner Farm.

AND WHEREAS, the Honorable Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, has set the above petition down for hearing, at a special session of said court, to be held in the Commissioners' Court Room at the Courthouse in the City of Gilmer, Texas, on the 4 day of June, 1945, at ten o'clock A.M., and has ordered and directed the undersigned to give notice of such hearing in accordance with law; now, therefore,

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN of such hearing to all persons concerned in order that they may appear before said court at the time and place above mentioned, and to attend such hearing, and to contend for or protest the ordering of such proposed bond election, as pray-

ed for in the petition, and at such hearing any person interested may appear before the Commissioners' Court in person, or by attorney, and contend for or protest the calling of such proposed bond election; and all persons interested shall have the right to offer testimony to show that said petition should or should not be granted and that the election prayed for should or should not be ordered.
