It is further ordered that such warrants shall be issued 80% from the Road & Bridge Fund and 20% from the General Fund. It is further ordered that this action shall be effective 6-1-45.

Motion made, seconded and carried that in conformity with the action taken by the recent session of the State Legislature pertaining to Salaries of County officials and their deputies, the County Clerk is authorized to issue warrants monthly to each of said officials and deputies affected by said laws in amounts of 20% more than provided for in 1944.
