ORDER OF
MAINTENANCE TAX ELECTION
TO INCREASE TAX

WHEREAS, on the 25 day of June, 1949, a petition was presented to me praying for an election to be held in (a) Coffeeyville Cons. Common School District No. 7, of this County, on the question of authorizing an additional tax of and at the rate of (b) .50 cents, in addition to the present tax of .50 cents heretofore voted, aggregating a total annual tax of not to ex-

ceed (c) \$1.00 on the One Hundred Dollars valuation of all taxable property in said District, said petition bearing the requisite number of signatures of the qualified resident property taxpaying voters of said District, who own taxable property in said District and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, and being in every respect in conformity with law; and

IT APPEARING that said district is a valid and legally constituted Common School District of Coffeyville Cons. #7 County, Texas, and;

It further appearing that said petition is signed by the requisite number of resident property taxpaying qualified voters of said school district and is otherwise in conformity with the law:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. A. Lunsford, in my official capacity as County Judge of Upshur County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held on the 9 day of July, 1949, at (d) Coffeyville School building in Coffeyville, Texas, in said (a) Coffeyville Cons. Common School District No. 7, to determine whether or not a majority of the legally qualified resident property taxpaying voters of said District, who own taxable property in said District and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, desire to increase the Maintenance Tax rate in said District, and to determine whether the Commissioners' Court of said County shall be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually an additional tax of and at the rate of (b) .50 cents, in addition to the present tax of .50 cents heretofore voted, aggregating a total annual tax of not to exceed (c) \$1.00 on the One Hundred Dollars valuation of all taxable property in said District.

Mrs. Annie Williamson is hereby appointed Presiding Officer for said election and shall select two Judges and two Clerks to Assist in holding the same and shall, within five days after said election has been held, make due return ther of to the Commissioners' Court of this County as is required by law for holding a General Election.

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this County and who are resident property taxpayers in said District, who own taxable property in said District and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be entitled to vote at said election, and all voters who favor the aforesaid additional taxation for school purposes shall have written or printed on their ballots, the words:

"FOR INCREASE OF SCHOOL TAX."

And those opposed to such additional taxation shall have written or printed on their ballots, the words:

"AGAINST INCREASE OF SCHOOL TAX."

The Sheriff of this County shall give notice of said election by posting three notices of said election in three public places in said District for not less than ten days prior to the date of said election.
