We, the undersigned resident property taxpaying qualified voters of Union Hill Consolidated County Line Common School District No. 36 of Upshur and Wood Counties, Texas, who own taxable property in said School District and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, respectfully pray that an election be ordered in said School District at the earliest date practicable for the purpose of submitting the following propositions to the resident property taxpaying qualified voters of said School District for their action thereupon:

PROPOSITION NO. 1.

"Shall the Commissioners' Courts of Upshur and Wood Counties be authorized to levy and collect annually a tax upon all taxable property in Union Hill Consolidated County Line Common School District No. 36 of Upshur and Wood Counties, Texas, of and at the rate of not exceeding \$1.50 on the \$100.00 valuation of taxable property of said School District, for the further maintenance of public free schools and the erection of school buildings within said

\$2,500.00 of bonds issued by Common School District No. 36 of Upshur County, Texas, numbered from 25 to 29, inclusive, and known as Common School District No. 36 Refunding Bonds, Series 1941, dated December 8, 1941, bearing interest at the rate of 4% per annum, interest payable annually on April 1st in each year, and said bonds maturing serially on the 1st day of April as follows: \$500.00 in each of the years 1951 to 1955, inclusive, without option of redemption, and being the remainder of an original issue of \$7,750.00;

and shall the Commissioners' Courts of Upshur and Wood Counties have the power to levy and collect annually a tax upon all taxable property within said School District sufficient to pay the interest thereon as it accrues and to create a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal as the same becomes due."

PROPOSITION NO. 3

"Shall the Commissioners' Courts of Upshur and Wood Counties be authorized to issue the Bonds of Union Hill Consolidated County Line Common School District No. 36 of Upshur and Wood Counties, to the amount of \$16,600.00, to become due and payable serially as follows: \$200.00 in each of the years 1951 to 1955, inclusive; \$800.00 in each of the years 1956 to 1958, inclusive; \$1,000.00 in each of the years 1959 to 1964, inclusive; \$1,200.00 in each of the years 1965 to 1970, inclusive; bearing interest at the rate not to exceed 4% per annum, on the faith and credit of said School District, for the purpose of constructing, repairing and equipping public freeschool buildings in said school District. And shall said Commissioners' Courts be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually while said bonds, or any of them, are outstanding, a tax upon all taxable property in said School District sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity."

WHEREAS, on the 5 day of June, 1950, there was presented to me, the petition of 20 persons asking that an election be ordered upon the question of maintenance tax, assumption of bonds, and the issuance of bonds by the Union Hill Consolidated County Line Common School District No. 36 of Upshur and Wood Counties, Texas;

WHEREAS, it appearing that the County of Upshur, Texas, is the county of jurisdiction in respect to said District.

It appearing that said petition is signed by at least twenty resident property tax-paying qualified voters of said School District who own taxable property in said school District and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, and is otherwise in conformity with law.

It further appearing that said School District has been heretofore properly established and as so established contains an area of 64.053 square miles and that no other district has been reduced in area below nine square miles by reason of the creation of said School District.

Now, Therefore, I, W. A. Lunsford, in my capacity as County Judge of Upshur County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held in said School District on the 28 day of June, 1950, which date is sufficient to allow the posting of the notice of said election for at least 10 full days prior to the date of said election, at which election, in accordance with said petition, the following propositions shall be submitted to the resident property taxpaying qualified voters of said School District for their action thereupon:

## PROPOSITION NO. 1

"Shall the Commissioners' Courts of Upshur and Wood Counties be authorized to levy and collect annually a tax upon all taxable property in Union Hill Consolidated County Line Common School District No. 36 of Upshur and Wood Counties, Texas, of and at the rate of not exceeding \$1.50 on the \$100.00 valuation of taxable property of said School District, for the further maintenance of public free schools and the erection of school buildings within said School District until the same shall be discontinued as provided by law."

## PROPOSITION NO. 2

"Shall the Union Hill Consolidated County Line Common School District No. 36 of Upshur and Wood Counties, Texas, assume and pay off the following outstanding bonds of Common School District No. 36 of Upshur County, Texas, to wit:

\$2,500.00 of bonds issued by Common School District No. 36 of Upshur County, Texas, numbered from 25 to 29, inclusive, and known as Common School District No. 36 Refunding Bonds, Series 1941, dated December 8, 1941, bearing interest at the rate of 4% per annum, interest payable annually on April 1st in each year, and said bonds maturing serially on the 1st day of April as follows: \$500.00 in each of the years 1951 to 1955, inclusive, without option of redemption, and being the remainder of an original issue of \$7,750.00. and shall the Commissioners' Courts of Upshur and Wood Counties have the power to levy and collect annually a tax upon all taxable property within said School District sufficient to pay the interest thereon as it accrues and to create a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal as the same becomes due."

1958, inclusive; \$1,000,000 in each of the years 1959 to 1964, inclusive; \$1,200.00 in each of the years 1965 to 1970, inclusive; bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, on the faith and credit of said School District, for the purpose of construction, repairing and equipping public free school buildings in said School District. And shall said Commissioners' Courts be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually while said bonds, or any of them, are outstanding, a tax upon all taxable property in said School District sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity."

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF THE BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF"

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF THE BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF"

As to each of the foregoing propositions, each voter shall mark out with black ink or black pencil one of the above expressions, thus leaving the other as indicating his vote on the three propositions, respectively.

None but resident property taxpaying qualified voters of said School District who own taxable property in said School District and who have duly rendered the same for taxation shall be allowed to vote at said election.

The Sheriff of this County shall give notice of said election by posting three copies of this Order for Maintenance Tax, Assumption and Bond Election at three different places within the boundaries of said School District, which posting shall be done not less than ten days prior to the date fixed for said election.

Within five days after said election, the officers holding the same shall make returns of the result thereof to the Commissioners' Court of this County, as required by law for holding a general election, and a true and correct copy of said return, together with the other proceedings shall be furnished the Commissioners' Court of Wood County.
