Commissioner A. B. Reynolds introduced the following order and moved its adoption by the Court:

WHEREAS, it is provided by Section 3, of Chapter 16, Acts 1926, First Called Session, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 92, Acts 1927, First Called Session, that the County Commissioners' Courts of the several counties of this State may establish one or more road districts in their respective counties, and may or may not include within the boundaries and limits of such districts, villages, towns, and municipal corporations, or any portion thereof, and may or may

not include previously created road districts and political subdivisions or precincts that have voted and issued road bonds, pursuant to Section 52, of Article 3, of the Constitution, by entering an order declaring such road district established and defining the boundaries thereof and,

WHEREAS, it appearing to this Court that it is desirable to establish a road district in Upshur County, Texas, to be hereafter known as ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 3-A; and,

WHEREAS, it further appearing to the Court that the boundaries of said Road District, as herein described and defined, do not overlap or embrace any part of a defined road district which has road bond debts outstanding, or any part of a political subdivision of the County which has road bond debts outstanding; and,

WHEREAS, it further appearing that all the territory to be included within said Road District is wholly within Upshur County, Texas;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS:

I.

That ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 3-A, of Upshur County, in the State of Texas, be, and the same is hereby established within the following metes and bounds, towit:

BEGINNING at a point where the Upshur County-Wood County Line intersects the Sabine River, said point being in the M. Putman Survey of Upshur County, Texas; THENCE North along the Upshur County-Wood County Line to its intersection with Big Sandy Creek in the T. K. Ellison Survey of Upshur County, Texas; THENCE down Big Sandy Creek with its meanderings in a Southeasterly direction to the intersection of said Big Sandy Creek with the Sabine River in the Peter Hoffman Survey of Upshur County, Texas; THENCE up the Sabine River with its meanderings in a Westerly direction to the intersection of said Sabine River with the Upshur County-Wood County Line, the place of beginning.

II.

That said ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 3-A, OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, is hereby established for the purpose of the construction, maintenance and operation of macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, under and by virtue of the constitution and laws of the State of Texas, including Section 52, of Article 3, of the Constitution, and Chapter 16, Acts 1926, First Called Session, and amendments thereto, and the said District is hereby made and created as a body corporate.

2. (b) Indian Rock School District No. 18, of said County, on the question of determining whether or not a majority of the legally qualified voters of said districts desire to be consolidated with each other and with the following districts located outside of said county, to wit:---

It appearing that each of said contiguous districts have been properly established and created and are legally and validly existing school districts;

THEREFORE, I, in my capacity of County Judge of Upshur County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held on the 6th day of July, 1950, in Gilmer Independent School District- Indian Rock Common School District No. 18 to determine whether or not a majority of the legally qualified voters of said Districts desire that they shall be consolidated as indicated above for school purposes.
