There came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 6th day of November, 1950, which returns are signed by O. O. Weaver, Presiding Judge, and Mrs. Lillie H. King, Judge, as to the Starville box in Smith County, Texas; P. L. Snow, Presiding Judge, and W. T.
