On this the 13 day of November, 1950, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, convened in regular session pursuant to proper call and notice with the following members present, to wit: W. A. Lunsford, County Judge; Jim Shockey, Commissioner, Precinct No. 1; E. H. Shaw, Commissioner, Precinct No. 2; A. B. Reynolds, Commissioner, Precinct No. 3; D. W. Gatlin Commissioner, Precinct No. 4; and with the following members absent, to wit: None constituting a quorum and among other proceedings had by said Court were the following:

There came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 6th day of November, 1950, which returns are signed by O. O. Weaver, Presiding Judge, and Mrs. Lillie H. King, Judge, as to the Starville box in Smith County, Texas; P. L. Snow, Presiding Judge, and W. T. Hallowsy, Judge, as to the Pritchett box in Upshur County, Texas; and Hoy Williams, Pre- siding Judge and Charles McChesney, Judge, as to the Gladewater box in Gregg County, Texas, in which election there was submitted to the resident qualified property tax-paying voters of Gladewater County Line Independent School District of Smith, Upshur, and Gregg Counties, Texas, and their action thereupon the following proposition:

Shall the Gladewater County Line Independent School District of Gregg, Smith, and Upshur Counties, Texas, be annexed to Kilgore Junior College District of Gregg and Rusk Coun- ties, for junior college purposes, only, and shall the territory included in Gladewater County Line Independent School District of Gregg, Smith, and Upshur Counties, Texas, become liable for taxes of and at the rate of not to exceed twenty (20%) cents on the One Hundred (\$100.00) Dol- lars valuation of taxable property of said territory for maintaining the junior college.

It appearing to the Court from said returns, duly and lawfully made, that there was cast in said election 631 valid and legal votes of which number 287 votes were cast "For Annexation and Maintenance Tax" and 344 votes were cast "Against Annexation and Maintenance Tax".

It is, therefore, found, determined, and declared by the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, that a majority of the legally qualified property tax-paying voters, who own taxable property in said school district and who had duly rendered the same for taxation, voting at said election, voted against said annexation and said maintenance tax.

The above order being read, it was moved and seconded that same do pass. Thereupon the question being called for the following members of the Court voted AYE:
