ORDER OF COMMISSIONERS' COURT

ESTABLISHING ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 3-B OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS.

THE STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF UPSHUR

ON THIS the 30th day of November, 1951, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, convened in Special session, at the regular meeting place of said Court in the Court-house at Gilmer, Texas, all members of the Court, to-wit:

H. L. Elwell,	County Judge, presiding; and
Jim Shockey	Commissioner, Precinct No. 1;
E. H. Shaw	Commissioner, Precinct No. 2;
J. E. Venn	Commissioner, Precinct No. 3;
Horsee Morris	Commissioner, Precinct No. 4;

being present; and, among other proceedings had by said Court, was the following:

Commissioner J. E. Venn introduced the following order and moved its adoption by the Court:

WHEREAS, it is provided by Section 3, of Chapter 16, Acts 1926, First Called Session as amended by Section 1, Chapter 92, Acts 1927, First Called Session, that the County Commissioner's Courts of the several counties of this State may establish one or more road districts in their respective counties, and may or may not include within the boundaries and limits of such districts, villages, towns, and municipal corporations, or any portion thereof, and may or may not include previously created road districts and political subdivisions or precincts that have voted and issued road bonds, pursuant to Section 52, of Article 3, of the Constitution, by entering an order declaring such road district established and defining the boundaries thereof; and,

WHEREAS, it appearing to this Court that it is desirable to establish a road district in Upshur County, Texas, to be hereafter known as ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 3-B; and

WHEREAS, it further appearing to the Court that the boundaries of said Road District as herein described and defined, do not overlap or embrace any part of a defined road district which has road bond debts outstanding, or any part of a political subdivision of the County which has road bond debts outstanding; and,

WHEREAS, it further appearing that all the territory to be included within said Road District is wholly within Upshur County, Texas;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS:

I.

That ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 3-B, OF UPSHUR COUNTY, in the STATE OF TEXAS, be and the same is hereby established within the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a point on the South Boundary line of the City Limits of the City of Gilmer, Texas, said point being the point of intersection of the said City limits and U. S. Highway No. 271; THENCE with said U. S. Highway No. 271, in a Southerly direction to the

point where the said highway intersects the County Line of Gregg and Upshur Counties; THENCE along said county Line in a Southwesterly direction to a point in said line on the North bank of Sabine River; THENCE in a Westerly direction along the North bank of said Sabine River to a point on said river at the beginning of a road known as the Jake Cannon road; THENCE in a Northerly direction along said Jake Cannon Road to a point where said road intersects with U. S. Highway No. 80; THENCE in a Northwesterly direction with said U. S. Highway No. 80 to the beginning of a road known as the Dunnagan and Youngblood road; THENCE in a Northerly direction along the said Tom Youngblood and Jack Dunnagan Road to Mings Chapel at a point where the said road intersects the Suffolk and Mings Chapel Road; THENCE with said road in a Northwesterly direction to where said road intersects the North and West edge of right of way of St. Louis Southwestern Railroad Company; THENCE northeasterly on the North side of said Railroad right of way to a point in said right of way where same intersects the East line of the J. B. B. Davenport Survey; THENCE North with said Davenport East boundary line to a point where said line intersects the City Limits of the City of Gilmer; THENCE South 45 degrees East with said City limits to a corner of same; THENCE South with said City limits 1100 feet to the Southern SW corner of the City limits of the City of Gilmer; THENCE East with the South line of said City limits to the place of beginning.

II.

That said ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 3-B, of UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, is hereby established for the purpose of the construction, maintenance and operation of macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, under and by virtue of the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, including Section 52, of Article 3, of the Constitution, and Chapter 16, Acts 1926, First Called Session, and amendments thereto, and the said District is hereby made and created as a body corporate.

The above order having been read, the motion of Commissioner J. E. Venn for its passage was duly seconded by Commissioner Jim Shockey.

Thereupon, the question being called for, the County Judge put the motion to a vote of the members of the Commissioners' Court, and the motion carried by the following vote: Commissioners Shockey, Shaw, Venn and Morris voting "AYE"; and none voting "NO".

The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order duly passed and adopted, and the County Clerk was instructed to record the same in the Minutes of the Court.
