ON THIS the 1st day of October, 1956, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, convened in Special session, at the regular meeting place of said Court in the Court-house at Gilmer, Texas, all members of the Court, to-wit:

being present; and, among other proceedings had by said Court, was the following:

Commissioner Jim Shockey introduced the following order and moved its adoption by the Court:

WHEREAS, heretofore, to-wit; on the 9th day of May, 1949, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, passed an order creating and establishing a defined district known as "ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-B, OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS", including within its limits the territory described and defined in such order, and which order is recorded in Volume 10, Pages 276 et seq., of the minutes of said Court, and reference thereto is hereby made for a description of the boundaries of said District; and

WHEREAS, thereafter, to-wit: on the 27th day of June, 1949, at an election held in said District for the purpose, the qualified electors thereof, voting at said election, authorized the issuance of the road bonds of said District in the principal sum of SEVENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000.00) and which bonds were duly approved by the

Attorney General and registered by the State Comptroller of Public Accounts, and issued and sold upon the faith and credit of said Road District Number 1-B of Upshur County, Texas; said bonds being dated on the 16th day of August, 1949, maturing \$75,000.00 on the 1st day of December, 1949; and

WHEREAS, All of the aforesaid bonded indebtedness, including interest thereon, has been fully and finally paid, and the said Road District Number 1-B has never voted or authorized the creation of any indebtedness, bonded or otherwise, on its faith and credit, subsequent to the 27th day of June, 1949; and

WHEREAS, the Forty-seventh Legislature, at its Regular Session in 1941, passed an Act providing that the commissioners' court of any county may abolish dormant road districts which have paid off and discharged all of the bonds issued and sold by any such road district; said Act being Chapter 147 of the General Laws passed at said Session, and approved and effective April 15, 1941; and

WHEREAS, it appearing to this Court that it will be necessary and in behalf of the public interest to abolish or dissolve the said dormant Road District Number 1-B of said County; therefore

BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS:

I.

That the order of this Court, made and entered on the 9th day of May, 1949, recorded in Volume 10, Pages 276 et seq., of the Minutes of this Court, creating and establishing said Road District Number 1-B of said County, is hereby repealed.

II.

That the said Road District Number 1-B, as created by the aforesaid order of this Court, shall be, and the said Road District is hereby, dissolved and shall be no longer recognized as a body politic and corporate in said County.

The above order having been read, the motion of Commissioner Jim Shockey for its passage was duly seconded by Commissioner Cloe Spencer.

Thereupon, the question being called for, the County Judge put the motion to a vote of the members of the Commissioners' Court, and the motion carried by the following vote; Commissioners Shockey, Holmes, Spencer, and Morris voting "AYE"; and none voting "NO".

The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order duly passed and adopted, and the County Clerk was instructed to record the same in the Minutes of the Court.

ON THIS the 1st day of October, 1956, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, convened in Special session, at the regular meeting place of said Court in the Courthouse at Gilmer, Texas, all members of the Court, to-wit:

being present; and, among other proceedings had by said Court, was the following:

Commissioner Jim Shockey introduced the following order and moved its adoption by the Court:

WHEREAS, it is provided by Section 3, of Chapter 16, Acts 1926, First Called Session, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 92, Acts 1927, First Called Session, that the county commissioners' courts of the several counties of this State may establish one or more road districts in their respective counties, and may or may not include within the boundaries and limits of such districts, villages, towns, and municipal corporations, or any portion thereof, and may or may not include previously created road districts and political subdivisions or precincts that have voted and issued road bonds, pursuant to Section 52, of Article 3, of the Constitution, by entering an order declaring such road district established and defining the boundaries thereof; and,

WHEREAS, it appearing to this court and it is desirable to establish a road district in Upshur County, Texas, to be hereafter known as ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-C; and,

WHEREAS, it further appearing to the Court that the boundaries of said Road District, as herein described and defined, do not overlap or embrace any part of a defined road district which has road bond debts outstanding, or any part of a political subdivision of the County which has road bond debts outstanding; and

WHEREAS, it further appearing that all the territory to be included within said Road District is wholly within Upshur County, Texas;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS:

I.

That ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-C, of UPSHUR COUNTY, in the STATE OF TEXAS, be, and the same is hereby established within the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a point 80 feet North of the Northwest Corner of Block No. 50 of the City of Gilmer, Texas, a point in the North Right of Way Line of Texas State Highway No. 154;

THENCE East along the North Right of Way Line of the Culberson Highway (State Highway No. 154) for a distance of two miles to the old Gilmer and Jefferson Public Road;

THENCE continuing Eastwardly with the North Right of Way Line of said Gilmer and Jefferson Public Road to the East Right of Way Line of the public road running South from Stamps Community and intersecting the Gilmer and Jefferson Public Road;

THENCE North along the East Right of Way Line of said public road running South from Stamps Community to the North Line of the James M. Dunn HR Survey of Upshur County, Texas;

THENCE East with the North Line of said James M. Dunn HR Survey, to the West Right of Way Line of State Highway No. 26;

THENCE South along the West Right of Way Line of State Highway No. 26 to the North Right of Way Line of the Gilmer and Jefferson Public Road;

THENCE East along the North Right of Way Line of said Gilmer and Jefferson Public Road to the Harrison County Line;

THENCE South with the Upshur-Harrison County Line to its intersection with Little Cypress Creek;

THENCE up Little Cypress Creek with the line between Gregg and Upshur Counties to the mouth of Prairie Creek;

THENCE up Prairie Creek with the line between Gregg and Upshur Counties to a point where said line leaves Prairie Creek;

THENCE South 37 deg. 30 min. West with the line between Gregg and Upshur Counties to a corner in same;

THENCE South 68 deg. West with the line between Gregg and Upshur Counties to its intersection with the East Right of Way Line of U. S. Highway No. 271;

THENCE in a Northerly direction with the East Right of Way Line of U. S. Highway No. 271 to the North line of Warren Avenue in the City of Gilmer, Texas;

THENCE West with the North line of Warren Avenue of the City of Gilmer, Texas, to the East Line of Henderson Street of the City of Gilmer, Texas;

THENCE North along the East Line of said Henderson Street to the N W Corner of Block No. 50 of the City of Gilmer, Texas, and continuing North to the place of beginning.

II.

That said ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-C, OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, is hereby established for the purpose of the construction, maintenance and operation of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, under and by virtue of the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, including Section 52, of Article 3, of the Constitution, and Chapter 16, Acts 1926, First Called Session, and amendments thereto, and the said District is hereby made and created as a body corporate.

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The above order having been read, the motion of Commissioner Jim Shockey for its passage was duly seconded by Commissioner Clay Spencer.

Thereupon, the question being called for, the County Judge put the motion to a vote of the members of the Commissioners' Court, and the motion was carried by the following vote: Commissioners Shockey, Holmes, Spencer and Morris voting "AYE"; and none voting "NO".

The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order duly passed and adopted, and the County Clerk was instructed to record the same in the Minutes of the Court.



PETITION TO THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT
OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, FOR ROAD BOND
ELECTION TO BE HELD IN ROAD DISTRICT
NUMBER 1-C OF SAID COUNTY.

THE STATE OF TEXAS ◊

COUNTY OF UPSHUR ◊

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS' COURT
OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS:

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, being more than fifty (50) in number and being resident property taxpaying voters of ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-C, OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, and who each owns taxable property in said Road District and who each has duly rendered his or her property for taxation, respectfully represent unto the Court as follows:

I.

That we desire this Honorable Court to order an election to be held in said Road District, for the purpose of submitting the following proposition to the qualified property taxpaying voters of said Road District, for their action thereupon, to-wit:

"WHETHER OR NOT the bonds of ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-C, OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, SHALL be issued in the total principal sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000.00) for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes or in aid thereof in said District, and which bonds are to bear interest at the rate of not exceeding THREE PER CENTUM (3%) per annum, and are to be payable at such times as may be deemed most expedient by the Commissioners' Court, but not to exceed Two (2) years from the date thereof, and whether or not ad valorem taxes shall be levied on all taxable property within said Road District for the purpose of paying the interest on the said bonds and providing a sinking fund for the redemption or payment thereof at maturity."

II.

We further represent to the Court that if said bonds are voted and issued the money received from the sale thereof will be applied to maintaining, graveling and applying an oil coat to and operating the following described graveled roads now in said district:

(1) County Road beginning at State Highway No. 154 at Douglas Davis' Store and running in a Southeasterly direction to the Gregg County Line and commonly known as the Shipp Road.

(2) County Road beginning at New Bethlehem Baptist Church and running generally South to the Gregg County Line.

(3) County Road beginning at Farm to Market Road No. 1650 at Milton Rash's place and running generally West to its intersection with Shipp Road above described.

(4) County Road beginning at State Highway No. 154 at Mrs. Harvey's Store and running generally South to the Shipp Road above described.

(5) County Road beginning at State Highway No. 154 at Clarence Hill's house and running South by Indian Rock Cemetery to the Shipp Road above described.

(6) County Road beginning at U. S. Highway No. 271 at Langford's Nursery and running generally East to the Shipp Road above described.

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




