ON THIS THE 11th day of June, 1962, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, convened in Special session, at the regular meeting place of said Court in the Courthouse at Gilmer, Texas, all members of the Court, to-wit:

being present; and, among other proceedings, had by said Court, was the following:

Commissioner Jim Shockey introduced the following order and moved its adoption by the Court:

WHEREAS, it is provided by Section 3, of Chapter 16, Acts 1926, First Called Session, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 92, Acts 1927, First Called Session, that the county commissioners' courts of the several counties of this State may establish one or more road districts in their respective counties, and may or may not include within the boundaries and limits of such districts, villages, towns, and municipal corporations, or any portion thereof, and may or may not include previously created road districts and political subdivisions or precincts that have voted and issued road bonds, pursuant to Section 52, of Article 3, of the Constitution, by entering an order declaring such road district established and defining the boundaries thereof; and,

WHEREAS, it appearing to this court and it is desirable to establish a road district in Upshur County, Texas, to be hereafter known as ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-D; and,

WHEREAS, it further appearing to the Court that the boundaries of said Road District, as herein described and defined, do not overlap or embrace any part of a defined road district which has road bond debts outstanding, or any part of a political subdivision of the County which has road bond debts outstanding; and,

WHEREAS, it further appearing that all the territory to be included within said Road District is wholly within Upshur County, Texas;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS:

I.

That ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-D, of UPSHUR COUNTY, in the STATE OF TEXAS, be, and the same is hereby established within the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a point 80 feet North of the Northwest corner of Block No. 50 of the City of Gilmer, Texas, a point in the North Right of Way Line of Texas State Highway No. 154;

THENCE East along the North Right of Way line of the Culberson Highway (State Highway No. 154) for a distance of two miles to the old Gilmer and Jefferson Public Road;

THENCE continuing Eastwardly with the North Right of Way Line of said Gilmer and Jefferson Public Road to the East Right of Way Line of the public road running South from Stamps Community and intersecting the Gilmer and Jefferson Public Road;

THENCE in a Northeasterly direction along the East and South Right of Way Line of said public road running Southwesterly from Stamps Community to the point to where said road intersects the WBL of Sarah Powell Survey;

THENCE North with said Sarah Powell WBL to the NWC of a 50 acre tract in the name of B. B. Wright, said corner being also the SWC of a 50 acre tract once owned by F. L. Shaw;

THENCE East with the NBL of the B. B. Wright land, NBL of a 50 acre tract of land in the name of Fine Hale, the NBL of the Levi Williams 100 acre tract and to a stake in NBL of Hollis Fagan 35 acre tract at the SWC of the D. T. Loyd land;

THENCE North with the WBL of the D. T. Loyd land to the NWC of same said corner being also the SWC of a 48.6 acre tract now owned by M. O. Karanaugh;

THENCE East with the NBL of said 48.6 acre tract to the NEC of same a corner in WBL of the W. L. Williford land;

THENCE North with the WBL of said Williford land to the NWC of same a stake in the NBL of the Sarah Powell HR;

THENCE East being the NEC of the Sarah Powell HR and continuing East to a stake in the WBL of the A. Wyatt HR Survey;

THENCE North with the WBL of said A. Wyatt Survey, and the WBL of the Ruben Wyatt Survey to the NWC of said Ruben Wyatt Survey;

THENCE East with the NBL of the Ruben Wyatt Survey to the NEC of same;

THENCE South with the EBL of said Ruben Wyatt Survey to the NWC of the Jno. T. Smith Survey (Abst. # 442);

THENCE East with the NBL of the Jno. T. Smith Survey and the Richard Diviney Survey to a point where said line intersects the West side of the Boxwood and Diana Public Road;

THENCE in a Southerly direction with and along the West side of said road to the point where said road intersects the road from Snow Hill;

THENCE East to a point on East side of said Boxwood and Diana Road;

THENCE in a Southerly direction with and along said Boxwood and Diana Road to the point where said road intersects the NBL of the J. M. Dunn HR Survey;

THENCE East with the NBL of said Dunn to the NEC of same;

THENCE South with the EBL of said J. M. Dunn Survey to the NWC of the Geo. C. Patillo Survey;

THENCE East to the NEC of said Patillo Survey;

THENCE South with the EBL of said Patillo Survey to the point where said line intersects the Public Road known as the Gilmer and Jefferson Road;

THENCE East along the North Right of Way Line of said Gilmer and Jefferson Public Road to the Harrison County Line;

THENCE South with the Upshur-Harrison County Line to its intersection with Little Cypress Creek;

THENCE up Little Cypress Creek with the line between Gregg and Upshur Counties to the mouth of Prairie Creek;

THENCE up Prairie Creek with the line between Gregg and Upshur Counties to a point where said line leaves Prairie Creek;

THENCE South 37 deg. 30 min. West with the line between Gregg and Upshur Counties to a corner in same;

THENCE South 68 deg. West with the line between Gregg and Upshur Counties to its intersection with the East Right of Way Line of U. S. Highway No. 271;

THENCE in a Northerly direction with the East Right of Way Line of U. S. Highway No. 271 to the North line of Warren Avenue in the City of Gilmer, Texas;

THENCE West with the North line of Warren Avenue of the City of Gilmer, Texas, to the East line of Henderson Street of the City of Gilmer, Texas;

THENCE North along the East line of said Henderson Street to the NWC of Block No. 50 of the City of Gilmer, Texas, and continuing North to the place of beginning.

II.

That said ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-D, of UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, is hereby established for the purpose of the construction, maintenance and operation of mecadamized, graveled, or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, under and by virtue of

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





TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF
UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS:

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, being more than fifty (50) in number and being resident property taxpaying voters of ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-D, OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, and who each owns taxable property in said Road District and who each has duly rendered his or her property for taxation, respectfully represent unto the Court as follows:

I.

That we desire this Honorable Court to order an election to be held in said Road District, for the purpose of submitting the following proposition to the qualified property taxpaying voters of said Road District, for their action thereupon, to-wit:

"WHETHER OR NOT the bonds of ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-D, OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, SHALL be issued in the total principal sum of ONE HUNDRED/^{FIFTY}THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$150,000.00) for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes or in aid thereof in said District, and which bonds are to bear interest at the rate of not exceeding THREE PER centum (3%) per annum, and are to be payable at such times as may be deemed most expedient by the Commissioners' Court, but not to exceed Two (2) years from the date hereof, and

whether or not ad valorem taxes shall be levied on all taxable property within said Road District for the purpose of paying the interest on the said bonds and providing a sinking fund for the redemption or payment thereof at maturity."

II.

We further represent to the Court that if said bonds are voted and issued the money received from the sale thereof will be applied to maintaining, graveling and applying an oil coat to and operating the following described graveled roads now in said district:

(1) County Road beginning at State Highway No. 154 at Douglas Davis' Store and running in a Southeasterly direction to the Gregg County Line and commonly known as the Shipp Road.

(2) County Road beginning at New Bethlehem Baptist Church and running generally South to the Gregg County Line.

(3) County Road beginning at Farm to Market Road No. 1650 at Milton Rash's place and running generally West to its intersection with Shipp Road above described.

(4) County Road beginning at State Highway No. 154 at Mrs. Harvey's Store and running generally South to the Shipp Road above described.

(5) County Road beginning at State Highway No. 154 at Clarence Hill's house and running South by Indian Rock Cemetery to the Shipp Road above described.

(6) County Road beginning at U. S. Highway No. 271 at Langford's Nursery and running generally East to the Shipp Road above described.

(7) County Road beginning at Farm to Market Road No. 1403 known as the Glenwood Road, at Ervin Hills Colored Housing Project and running generally South to the East Mountain-Union Grove Road at Noble Tuttle's house and generally known as the Pattonfield Road.

(8) County Road beginning at the Glenwood Road at the Will Barber place and running generally West to the Pattonfield Road.

(9) County Road beginning at Piedmont Colored School and running generally East to the Pattonfield Road.

(10) County Road beginning at U. S. Highway No. 271 at Icie Phillips' place and running generally North to the Pattonfield Road.

(11) County Road beginning at the Glenwood Road at George Sanders Place and running generally South to the Glenwood-West Mountain Road, and generally known as the Bain Road.

(12) County Road beginning on Glenwood Road near old McClelland Place and running generally Northeast to Dead End.

(13) County Road beginning at the Glenwood Road at Woodland Baptist Church and running generally West to the Bain Road above described.

(14) County Road beginning at the Bain Road above described at N. A. Blalack's Place and running generally West to the Pattonfield Road.

(15) County Road beginning at the Bain Road above described at Carl Pittman's Place and running generally West to its intersection with road running from Bain Road to Pattonfield Road.

(16) County Road beginning at State Highway 26 at Edward Simpsons' place and running generally Northwesterly to W. A. Townsend's Store and where the County Road intersects with Fm Road No. 555.

(17) County Road beginning at Glenwood-West Mountain Road at Virgil Smith's Place and running generally South to the East Mountain-West Mountain Road.

(18) County Road beginning at the Glenwood-Thornton City Road at the Glenwood Cemetery and running generally West and South to the Glenwood-Thornton City Road.

(19) County Road beginning at FM Road No. 1403 at Robert Langston's Place and running generally Southwesterly to where the same intersects with the Pattonfield Road.

(20) County Road beginning at East Mountain-Union Grove Road at the East Mountain School and running generally West to the East Mountain-Union Grove Road.

(21) County Road beginning at East Mountain-Union Grove Road at King Landers' Place and running generally South by General American Warehouse to paved road at the Cureton house and East from Clemon Johnson's home to Larry Ortlan's home and North to paved road.

(22) County Road beginning at East Mountain-Union Grove Road at Uncle Joe Miller's place and running generally South to paved road.

(23) County Road beginning at Farm to Market Road No. 1649 at Townsend's Store and running generally East by Valley View School to Graceton and generally known as the Valley View Road.

(24) County Road beginning at Farm to Market Road No. 1972 at Will Harris' Place and running generally South to Graceton.

(25) County Road beginning at Farm to Market Road No. 1972 at Graceton Church of Christ and running generally South by Maddox Cemetery to State Highway No. 154.

(26) County Road beginning at State Highway No. 154 at Louie Covin's Store and running generally North to Graceton.

(27) County Road beginning at FM Road No. 1972 running generally North to FM Road No. 555.

(28) County Road beginning at State Highway No. 154 near Louie Covin's Store and running Southeast to State Highway No. 26 and generally known as the Ridge Road.

(29) County Road beginning at the Ridge Road above described at L. C. Brannon's house and running generally East to State Highway No. 26.

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- (30) All Streets in Diana, Texas.
- (31) County Road beginning at the Floyd Cemetery going South where the same intersects with the Shipp Road.
- (32) County Road beginning at State Highway No. 26 at Edward Simpson's place and running generally North to the North Line of Road District No. 1-D.
- (33) County Road beginning at State Highway No. 26 at the North Line of Road District No. 1-D and running generally East to the Harrison County Line and generally known as the old Gilmer-Jefferson Public Road.
- (34) County Road beginning at the Brawley property and at the intersection of the Bethlehem Road and running generally West to a Dead End, being approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.
- (35) County Road running from James, Texas, North to the Old Gilmer-Jefferson Road above described.
- (36) County Road running from the old Buie Place South of Ashland, Texas, North to the Old Gilmer-Jefferson Public Road.
- (37) County Road beginning at FM Road No. 1403 and running generally East until the same intersects with the Bethlehem Road.
- (38) County Road beginning at George Jones' Place North of State Highway No. 154 running generally East to its intersection with road running North from Ashland, Texas.
- (39) County Road beginning at Highway No. 271 and running generally East passed the Calvert Willis property to a Dead End and being approximately a mile long.
- (40) County Road beginning on road running East from the George Jones' Place above mentioned and running North to Dead End.
- (41) County Road beginning at road running North from Ashland, Texas, at Dock Richard's Place and running generally East to Harrison County Line by Barber's Place.
- (42) County Road beginning at the Ervin Floyd Place and running generally North to Highway No. 154.
- (43) County Road beginning on State Highway No. 26 near East End of Ridge Road above described, running North-east through Old James, crossing State Highway No. 26 to Harrison County Line.
- (44) County Road beginning on Road No. 35 immediately East of its intersection with State Highway No. 154, and running generally North to Dead End.
- PAVED ROADS
- (45) Old 271 leading off 271 to County line at Olen Smith.
- (46) Back West to Humble Camp.
- (47) East out by George Cunnings place to the County line.
- (48) Leading off of Glen Wood road out by the Salters place.

III.

AND WE FURTHER REPRESENT unto the Court that the proposed improvement will be for the benefit of all taxable property situated in said ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-D, OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS.

WHEREFORE, we respectfully petition this Honorable Court to fix a time and place at which this petition shall be heard, which date shall not be less than fifteen (15) nor more than thirty (30) days from the date of the order setting such petition down for hearing, and proper notices hereof shall be given as required and prescribed by law, and that after such hearing, if found that such proposed improvement would be for the benefit of all taxable property situated in said ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-D, OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, that then this Court shall make and cause to be entered of record upon its Minutes an order directing that an election be held within and for said ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 1-D, at a lawful date to be fixed in such order, for the purpose of determining the question herein mentioned, and that notice of such election shall be given for the length of time and in the manner required and prescribed by law, all of which is respectfully submitted.

WHEREFORE, we further pray that this Court do, upon such hearing, take such action and do such things with reference to the matters herein mentioned as it is authorized to do under the provisions and requirements of Chapter 16, of the General Laws passed by the Thirty-ninth Legislature, at its First Called Session in 1926, and amendments thereto.
