RESOLUTION FOR UPSHUR COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT

WHEREAS, Upshur County and the Texas Highway Department have entered into a right of way contract for the purchase of right of way on U.S. Highway 80 in Upshur County from the Wood County Line 5 Miles East, and

WHEREAS, the East City Limit Line of the City of Big Sandy bisects a tract of land owned by Charles Still that is required for new right of way for re-locating a section of U.S. Highway 80, and

WHEREAS, a portion of the present U.S. Highway 80 which traverses Charles Still's tract will not likely be needed for the reconstruction of U.S. Highway 80 nor will it be needed for continued use by the public as a road, and

WHEREAS, the State's policy regarding surplus right of way that could be used in exchange on new right of way would be of benefit to Upshur County, the City of Big Sandy, and the State;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commissioners Court that by copy of this Resolution the State Highway Department be advised that the County concurs in the possible exchange of right of way with Charles Still and that the State be advised that Upshur County has no further need of this segment of present U.S. Highway 80 for use of the public as a road at which time it becomes surplus upon the completion of relocated U.S. Highway 80 and when U.S. Highway 80 is placed in use for the traveling public.

Field Notes for Tract No. 1
 Name: Charles L. Still
 (Surplus Right of Way)

Being 5.570 acres of land, more or less, out of and a part of a 10.76 acre parcel of land in the existing Right of Way of U.S. Highway 80 and lying in the John Carson Survey, Abstract No. 69 and the John Sanders Survey, Abstract No. 438, Upshur County, Texas; said 10.76 acre parcel of Right of Way being the same land decreed to the State of Texas by condemnation August 23, 1932 and recorded in Volume 7, Page 160 of the Commissioners Court Minutes, Upshur County, Texas; said 5.570 acre tract being more particularly described by metes and bounds as follows:

BEGINNING at the point of intersection of the Big Sandy East City Limit and existing U. S. Highway 80 South Right of Way Line, said point being 800 feet South of said City Limits intersection with the North boundary line of Charles L. Stills 66 1/2 acre tract;

THENCE North 55° 30' West along said existing Right of Way Line, a distance of 455.36 feet to a point;

THENCE in a Westerly direction, following a curve to the left of radius 1382.39 feet, a chord bears North 58° 08' West with a length of 126.64 feet, a distance of 126.70 feet to a point of intersection with the proposed Right of Way Line of relocated U. S. Highway 80;

THENCE South 77° 41' East, following the proposed Right of Way Line of relocated U. S. Highway 80, a distance of 287.19 feet to a point, said point being at right angle to and 100 feet from Engineers Survey Line Station 1264 + 67.03 of relocated U. S. Highway 80;

THENCE South 65° 31' East, a distance of 99.75 feet to a point of intersection with the existing North Right of Way Line of U. S. Highway 80,

THENCE South 55° 30' East, a distance of 128.37 feet to a point;

THENCE South 34° 30' West, a distance of 20.0 feet to a point;

THENCE South 55° 30' East, at 20.64 feet cross East City Limit of Big Sandy, continuing a total distance of 628.68 feet to a point;

THENCE in a Southeasterly direction, following a curve to the left of radius 1903.27 feet, a chord bears South 67° 34' East with a length of 795.72 feet, a distance of 801.63 feet to a point;

THENCE South 79° 38' East, a distance of 248.63 feet to a point;

THENCE South 10° 22' West, a distance of 125.0 feet to a point in the existing South right of way line of U. S. Highway 80;

THENCE North 79° 38' West, a distance of 248.63 feet to a point;


THENCE in a Westerly direction, following a curve to the right of radius 2028.27 feet, a chord bears North 67° 34' West with a length of 847.98 feet, a distance of 854.28 feet to a point;


THENCE North 55° 30' West, a distance of 228.68 feet to a point;

THENCE North 34° 30' East, a distance of 25.0 feet to a point;

THENCE North 55° 30' West, a distance of 310.64 feet to the point of beginning, containing an area of 5.570 acres of land, more or less, of which 1.032 acres rests in the John Carson Survey and the Big Sandy City Limits and 4.538 acres being in the John Sanders Survey to the East of the Big Sandy City Limit.

BE IT REMEMBERED THAT Jack G. Scott, Quitman, Texas, was appointed Official Shorthand Reporter of the 115th Judicial District of Texas on May 16, 1949; that he has served continuously since that date, and is now serving in such capacity.

BE IT FURTHER REMEMBERED that the 57th Legislature enacted legislation providing that the Official Shorthand Reporter of the 115th Judicial District of Texas shall receive a salary of not less than Forty-eight Hundred (4,800.00) Dollars per annum, and not more than Eight Thousand (\$8,000.00) per annum, in addition to compensation for transcript fees as provided by law:

BE IT FURTHER REMEMBERED that on the 18th day of December, 1967, the salary of Jack G. Scott, Official Court Reporter, 115th Judicial District of Texas, was set, fixed and determined at the sum of Seven Thousand, Nine Hundred and Twenty (\$7,920.00) Dollars per annum, the entire salary being paid in equal monthly installments by the County of Wood and the County of Upshur:

BE IT FURTHER REMEMBERED THAT THE 61ST Legislature enacted legislation providing that the 115th Judicial District of Texas should have concurrent jurisdiction in Marion County, Texas, with the 76th Judicial District;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that as of September 1, 1969, the salary of Jack G. Scott, Official Shorthand Reporter, 115th Judicial District of Texas, is hereby apportioned

among the three counties heretofore mentioned on a per month basis as follows:

Upshur County, Texas-----\$297.00

Wood County, Texas----- 297.00

Marion County, Texas----- 66.00!

said salary being payable by the Commissioners' Court of each County in the 115th Judicial District of Texas out of any available fund from which such Commissioners' Courts may lawfully pay the same.

This order shall be certified by the Clerk of this Court in each County of the District to the Commissioners' Court of his County for observance.

MADE AND ENTERED this 16th day of September, 1969, in Upshur County, Texas, Wood County, Texas, and Marion County, Texas, and the Clerk of the District Court in each County is directed to enter this order on the Civil Minutes of the 115th Judicial District Court in his County.
