Your Petitioner, ARKANSAS LOUISIANA GAS COMPANY, a Delaware Corporation, having a permit to do business in the State of Texas, and with its principal office in Shreveport, Louisiana, respectfully represents that it is now engaged in the sale and transportation of natural gas, and has the authority to construct pipelines for transporting such gas through pipelines, and that it desires to construct the following facilities at the location described:

(To cross County Road in the Pineview Addition to Gilmer, as indicated in red by plat SL-5264, attached.)

and that in the construction of the said gas pipeline___, it will be necessary to lay its pipeline___, in and across County Roads in Upshur County, Texas, at the locations shown on the plat attached hereto and made a part hereof.

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ORDER GIVING NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE WARRANTS FOR RIGHTS-OF-WAY AND LEVYING THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF

ON THIS, the 9 day of Feb, 1970, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, convened in regular session at the regular meeting place thereof in the Courthouse at Gilmer, Texas, the meeting being open to the public and notice of said meeting, giving the date, place and subject thereof, having been posted as prescribed by Article 6252-17, Section 3A, V.A.T.C.S., and the following members of the Court were present:

The County Judge submitted the following order.

WHEREAS, this Commissioners' Court has ascertained and determined that it is necessary for the County to acquire and purchase lands necessary for rights-of-way in respect of Federal and Texas State Highways, Farm-to-Market, Lateral and County Roads in said County, and to defray all expenses incidental thereto; and,

WHEREAS, the time warrants proposed to be issued for the purposes aforesaid, are not to exceed in the aggregate the sum of SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000); and,

WHEREAS, this being a regular term of Court with all members present, it is now proper to levy a tax for the payment of the debt service requirements of the warrants to be issued; therefore,

BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: That it is the intention of the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, to pass an order on the 9 day of March, 1970 (which date is not less than fourteen (14) days from the date of this order), authorizing the incurrence of claims and accounts against the Road and Bridge Fund of the County, for the purpose of acquiring and purchasing lands necessary for the rights-of-way in respect of Federal and Texas State Highways, Farm-to-Market, Lateral and County Roads in said County, and to defray all expenses incidental thereto, and which said proposed indebtedness will not exceed the principal sum of SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000).

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SECTION 2: By the same order, this Court will authorize the issuance of time warrants bearing interest at a rate not exceeding SIX PER CENTUM (6%) per annum, for the purpose of paying and cancelling the indebtedness evidenced by such claims and accounts against the Road and Bridge Fund of the County, and which said time warrants will mature serially over a period of years, the maximum maturity date to be not later than the 31st day of December, 2001, and the said Court has levied a continuing direct annual ad valorem tax out of amounts available to the County under Article VIII, Section 9 of the Constitution, for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the indebtedness which will be in due course represented by such time warrants when and as the same are issued and delivered.

SECTION 3: That the County Judge is hereby authorized to issue and publish notice of intention to issue the proposed warrants, and which said notice of intention shall be in words and figures as follows:

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE WARRANTS FOR
RIGHTS-OF-WAY

TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES:

TAKE NOTICE, that on the 9 day of March, 1970, the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, will pass an order authorizing the issuance of claims and accounts against the Road and Bridge Fund of the County, for the purpose of acquiring and purchasing lands necessary for the rights-of-way in respect of Federal and Texas State Highways, Farm-to-Market, Lateral and County Roads in said County, and to defray all expenses incidental thereto, and which said proposed indebtedness will not exceed the principal sum of SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000)

FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that by the same order, the said Commissioners' Court will authorize the issuance of time warrants, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed SIX PER CENTUM (6%) per annum, for the purpose of paying and cancelling the indebtedness evidenced by such claims and accounts against the Road and Bridge Fund of the County, and which said time warrants will mature serially over a period of years, the maximum maturity date to be not later than the 31st day of December, 2001, and the said Court has levied a continuing direct annual ad valorem tax out of the amounts available to the County under Article VIII, Section 9 of the Constitution of Texas, for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the indebtedness hereby proposed to be created, and which said indebtedness will be in due course represented by such time warrants when and as the same are issued and delivered.

THIS NOTICE is issued pursuant to that certain order passed by the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, on the 9 day of Feb, 1970, which order is recorded in Volume 9 of the Minutes of said Court, and such order is adopted by reference and shall be considered as much a part of this notice as if incorporated herein in full detail.

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SECTION 4: That said notice shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation, published in said County, once a week for two consecutive weeks prior to the date fixed for passing the proposed order authorizing the issuance of the proposed warrants, the date of the first publication to be at least fourteen (14) full days prior to said date

SECTION 5: That to provide for the payment of the debt service requirements on the said warrants, being (i) the interest on said warrants and (ii) a sinking fund for their redemption at maturity or a sinking fund of 2% (whichever amount shall be greater), there shall be and there is hereby levied for the current year and each succeeding year thereafter while said warrants or interest thereon shall remain outstanding and unpaid, a sufficient tax on each one hundred dollars' valuation of taxable property in said County, adequate to pay such debt service requirements, and full allowance being made for delinquencies and costs of collection; said tax (out of the amount available to the County under Article VIII, Section 9 of the Constitution of Texas) shall be assessed and collected each year and applied to the payment of the said debt service requirements, and the same shall not be diverted to any other purpose.

The above order having been read in full, it was moved by Commissioner Hackler and seconded by Commissioner Nobles that it be passed. Thereupon, the question being called for, the following members of the Court voted "AYE": County Judge McKinley, and Commissioners Nobles, Holmes, Fannin and Hackler, and none voted "NO".
