ORDER GIVING NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE  
WARRANTS FOR ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

THE STATE OF TEXAS, )  
COUNTY OF UPSHUR. )

ON THIS, the 8th day of February, 1971, the Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas convened in regular session, being open to the public, at the regular meeting place thereof in the Courthouse at Gilmer, Texas, the following members of the Court, to-wit:

L. G. McKinley,	County Judge, Presiding; and
Offie Nobles,	Commissioner, Precinct #1,
Bryant Holmes,	Commissioner, Precinct #2,
E. L. Fannin,	Commissioner, Precinct #3, and
Neal McCurry,	Commissioner, Precinct #4,

being present and in attendance; and among other proceedings had by said Court was the following:

The County Judge introduced the following order:

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas, has ascertained and determined that it is necessary to resurface approximately 13.8 miles of county roads in Precinct #1 and incur all expense incidental thereto, and

WHEREAS, the time warrants proposed to be issued for the purpose aforesaid are not to exceed the aggregate sum of THIRTY FIVE THOUSAND (\$35,000.00) DOLLARS; therefore,

BE IT ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas:

Section #1: That it is the intention of the Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas, to pass an order on the 8th day of March, 1971, being the regular March Term of the Commissioners Court, and which date is not less than fourteen (14) days from the date of this order, authorizing the incurrence of claims and accounts against the Road and Bridge Fund, Precinct #1 of Upshur County, Texas for the purpose of resurfacing the approximately

13.8 miles of County Roads and to defray all expenses incidental thereto, and which said proposed indebtedness will not exceed THIRTY FIVE THOUSAND (\$35,000.00) DOLLARS.

Section #2: By the same order this Court will authorize the issuance of time warrants bearing interest at a rate not exceeding Five (5%) per centum per annum, for the purpose of paying and cancelling the indebtedness evidence by such claims and accounts against the Road and Bridge Fund, Precinct #1 of the County, and which said time warrants will mature serially over a period of years, the maximum maturity date to be not later than the 31st day of December, 1975; and the said court will levy a continuing direct annual ad valorem tax out of the Road and Bridge Fund Tax, authorized by Section 9, Article 8, of the Constitution, for the purpose of paying the principal of said interest on the indebtedness hereby proposed to be created, and which said indebtedness will be in due course represented by such time warrants when and as the same are issued and delivered.

Section #3: That the County Judge is hereby authorized to execute Notice of Intention to Issue the Proposed Warrants, and which said Notice of Intention shall be in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE WARRANTS  
FOR ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

TO THE RESIDENT PROPERTY TAXPAYING VOTERS OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS

Take notice that on the 8th day of March, 1971, being the regular March Term of Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas, the Commissioners Court will pass an order authorizing the incurrence of claims and accounts against the Road and Bridge Fund, Precinct #1 of Upshur County for the purpose of resurfacing approximately 13.8 miles of County roads, and which said indebtedness will not exceed THIRTY FIVE THOUSAND (\$35,000.00) DOLLARS.

Further take notice that by the same Order the Commissioners Court will authorize the issuance of time warrants, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding Five (5%) per centum per annum, for the purpose of paying and cancelling the indebtedness evidenced by such claims and accounts against the Road and Bridge Fund, Precinct #1 of Upshur County, and which said time warrants will mature serially over a period of years, the maximum maturity date to be not later than December 31, 1975; and said Court will levy a continuing direct annual ad valorem tax out of the Road and Bridge Fund Tax authorized by Section 9, Article 8, of the Constitution, for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the indebtedness hereby proposed to be created, and which said indebtedness will be in due course represented by such time warrants when and as the same are issued and delivered.

This notice is issued pursuant to that certain Order passed by the Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas, on the 8th day of February, 1971 and is recorded in the minutes of said court.

The conditions of the above contract are such that, whereas, the above bounden pledgor  
First National Bank, Gilmer, Texas was on the 4th day of February, A. D. 19 71,  
 duly and legally chosen by the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas,  
 as County Depository for said county for a period of two years ending sixty days from the time fixed

by law for the next selection of a depository, upon its bidding and agreeing to pay the County of Upshur interest on "time deposits" on daily balances kept in said depository of said County of Upshur at the rate of None per cent per annum, said interest payable monthly.

NOW, THEREFORE, if the above bounden pledgor First National Bank of Gilmer shall faithfully do and perform all the duties and obligations devolving on it by law as the county depository of Upshur County, and shall upon presentation pay checks drawn on it by the county treasurer of Upshur County, Texas; on "demand deposits" accounts in such depository; and all checks drawn upon any "time deposit" account upon presentation, after the expiration of the period of notice required in the case of "time deposits," and shall faithfully keep said county funds, and account for same according to law, and shall faithfully keep and account for all funds belonging to the county which are deposited with it under the requirements of Article 2547, Vernon's Annotated Revised Civil Statutes, and shall include State funds collected by the tax collector, and shall pay the interest at the time and at the rate hereinbefore stipulated on "time deposits"; and shall, at the expiration of the term for which it has been chosen, turn over to its successor all the funds, property, and other things of value, coming into its hands as depository, then and in that event this contract is to be and become null and void and the securities above shall be returned to the pledgor, otherwise to remain in full force and effect, hereby specially authorizing the Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, to sell at public or private sale, with or without notice to the pledgor, the securities, or any part thereof, and apply the proceeds of sale to the satisfaction of any indebtedness arising by virtue of the violation of any or all the conditions of this contract.

The above provision is given in addition to any remedy the pledgee may have in any suit brought on this contract in any court in this State.

Any suit arising out of or in any way connected with this contract, shall be tried in the County of Upshur and State of Texas in any Court therein having jurisdiction of the subject matter thereof.




