The Commissioners Court met in regular session with all members present: Offie Nobles, J. W. Meadows, Charles Still, Floyd Drennan and Judge Everett Dean. Judge Dean presided.

The visitors present at the meeting were: Mrs. Jack Hogg, Mrs. Johnnie Pool, Mrs. Gladys Robinson, Mrs. B. D. Rogers, and Willie Thompson the Upshur County Court yard landscaping committee. Also present was Phillip Williams with the Gilmer Radio Station and Mrs. Sarah Greene with the Gilmer Mirror.

Judge Dean read the minutes of the previous meeting. After the minutes were approved, Judge Dean made a motion that the minutes be accepted as read and a second was made by Offie Nobles. Motion carried.

The landscaping committee presented bids from three Nurseries stating prices for the landscaping of the County Court Yard. A discussion on these bids was held but the Judge said that the Court would visit other places to look at the landscaping before deciding anything furthur on this matter. The Landscaping Committee is to meet with the Court again within the next two weeks. (Copy of the bids are attached.)

Willie Thompson said that there were some people who want to make donations to help with the landscaping program. He also suggested that the donations be given to Judge Dean. Judge Dean said that he thought that the office of Willie Thompson would be more appropriate to take these donations because someone was there all the time. No furthur action was taken on this matter.

A Permit Application was presented from Mobil Oil Corporation asking for permission to place a pipeline within the ROW of County Road, Duncan Road located off the White Oak Road. Offie Nobles made motion to accept this application and a second was made by J. W. Meadows. Motion carried. (Copy of the permit is attached.)

A Permit Application from General Telephone was presented asking permission to lay an underground cable from Highway 2685 to a home on a dirt road. No action was taken on this permit.

Judge Dean asked that a motion be made stating the days that the Courthouse would be closed for the Christmas Holidays. No action was taken on this.

Later, the Judge made a statement saying that the Courthouse and the County Library will be closed on December 24th., 25th., and 26th., 1975.

Judge Dean asked the Court who they would like to send as a representative to a school on Election that is to be held in Austin, Texas, December 17, 1975. J. W. Meadows made a motion that the County Clerk, J. B. Hill, Jr. and Bill Jones, Tax Assessor-Collector be given permission to attend this meeting. Charles Still made a second to this motion. Motion carried.

County Auditor, Bruce Morris asked permission to attend a Seminar for Government Executives to be held at the University of Texas, Austin, Texas, January 12th through 16th, 1976. J. W. Meadows made a motion to give him permission to attend this meeting and a second was made by Floyd Drennan. Motion carried.

Floyd Drennan made a motion for Court to adjourn and a second was made by J. W. Meadows. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned.



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


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## TYPICAL COUNTY ROAD CROSSING


