



UPSHUR COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT

GILMER, TEXAS

August 30, 1976

Commissioners Court met in special session with all members present. Offie Nobles, J.W. Meadows, Charles Still, Floyd Drennan and Judge Everett Dean. Judge Dean presided.

Judge Dean read the minutes of the court meeting of August 23, 1976. J.W. Meadows made a motion the minutes stand approved, except the permit approved for Robert Dooley for a culvert on Camp Natawa Road. This permit should have been for another road. The motion was seconded by Charles Still. Motion carried.

A permit application from Continental Telephone of Texas was presented to the court for use of a Right-of-Way on County Road, Tyler Street, Big Sandy Texas, to place a buried telephone cable. Charles Still made a motion to approve this permit. Seconded by Floyd Drennan. Motion carried.

A permit application from Joe M. Glenn to place a water line on county road Holly Lane. Charles Still made a motion to approve this application. Seconded by J.W. Meadows. Motion carried.

A permit application from Tommy Bynum to use Right-of-Way of county road Chinaberry Road to place a buried phone line and also a water line. Charles Still made a motion to approve this permit. Seconded by Floyd Drennan. Motion carried. (Copies of all permits attached).

Mr. Taylor Turman met with the court, ^{General} asking for an increase in pay for all workers helping hold the elections. After a brief discussion Judge Dean told Mr. Turman this would be discussed next Thursday September 2, 1976.

Tony Williams, city manager of Gladewater, met with the court asking that the Commissioners furnish three dump trucks and one maintainer to be used to work the roads at Gladewater Lake. This is to be in exchange for Gladewater fire protection when it is needed. City of Gladewater would furnish all fuel and the workers would only work eight hours a day while working on this road. This matter would be taken up at next Thursdays meeting. They will give him an answer then.

A proclamation was presented to the court by Judge Dean. It was a Proclamation of Beliefs from the County Judge of Victoria County. Offie Nobles made a motion to adopt this proclamation for Upshur County. J.W. Meadows seconded it. Motion carried.

Judge Dean asked that the court discontinue until Thursday September 2, 1976.

A Proclamation Of Beliefs

Foreword: This statement is written for the endorsement of the individual, on whom the world must ultimately depend for its answers. It is a re-affirmation of widely-held beliefs which should be articulated.

I. WE BELIEVE ABOUT THE WORLD:

The world today urgently needs a reconstruction of the spirit. As problems accumulate, the hope of any answer diminishes. Every nation is involved.

If the world is to find sanity and safety it must come nation by nation. Therefore each nation must assume its own share of responsibility.

The hour has come when every man is called to define his beliefs openly and to join others with strong convictions in seeking solutions.

A drastic change of heart in this nation will make a profound impact on the world. This change should come first in the individual, then in the institution, and finally in every area of national life.

II. WE BELIEVE ABOUT OUR NATION:

Our Homes: The state of the nation demands unity in the home. Unity comes when parents agree on what is right and practice it. Their example supports their authority for discipline in the home.

Our Schools: For the sake of family and country, the student, teachers and parents should unite in a single aim: that the student fulfill his greatest promise.

Our Business and Labor: Business and Labor provide for the material needs of all people everywhere. Together they can supply the drive for moral resurgence in our country. They understand that moral recovery and economic recovery share equally in importance.

Our Government: The character of our leadership is determined by the character of our people. People demanding much of themselves will demand much of their leaders. People in all responsible positions and leaders at all levels should bring a courageous new initiative to government.

Our Laws: Respect for the law must be taught, instilled and emphasized in every undertaking. Those who break the law should be confronted by an indignant society demanding justice.

III. WE BELIEVE ABOUT OUR NATION AND THE WORLD:

The fullest contribution to a secure world can be made by people who are free: free from fear, free from hate, free from greed. Our country must therefore become a nation convinced of the necessity of freedom for every man in every land.

Such freedom can be established in the world only through its own compelling force as the superior idea. So the life of the nation, its thoughts and its actions should be measured by one indestructible standard: Freedom.

IV. WE BELIEVE ABOUT OURSELVES:

Whatever the future holds, we are confident, and committed to placing "service above self".

We will openly assert ourselves in searching for answers. Standing firm as free individuals and united with those of similar beliefs, we will make our voices heard.

We accept the above beliefs for our own lives and call upon people everywhere to join us in this Proclamation. Our aim is to show, through wide-spread endorsement, that these beliefs are held by millions, and thereby to supply a unifying force in today's divided world.

This Proclamation was prepared by the Victoria Rotary Club with the assistance of the Northside Rotary Club, both in Victoria, Texas. These clubs give their full consent for the use of this proclamation by any other person or organization. They would, however, ask that it be used in its complete text if reproduced.

O R D E R

WHEREAS, the 62nd Legislature of the State of Texas enacted into Law by the passage of H.B. 384 an Act relating to compensation, expenses and allowances of certain officers and employees, and said Statute became effective January 1, 1972; and

WHEREAS, said Statute provides that the Salary of the Official Shorthand Reporter for each District Court shall be fixed by the Judge of said Court:

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that as of January 1, 1977, the salary of Jack G. Scott, Official Court Reporter of the 115th Judicial District Court, composed of Upshur, Wood and Marion Counties, Texas, be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Thirteen Thousand, One Hundred and Fifty-nine Dollars and Seventy-nine Cents, (\$13,159.79) per annum, to be paid Five Thousand, Nine Hundred and Twenty-one Dollars and Ninety-one Cents (\$5,921.91) by Upshur County and Five Thousand, Nine Hundred and Twenty-one Dollars and Ninety-one Cents (\$5,921.91) by Wood County and One Thousand and Three Hundred and Fifteen Dollars and Ninety-seven Cents (\$1,315.97) by Marion County in monthly payments out of any fund of the County that the Commissioners Court is authorized to pay the same and shall direct the payment therefrom.

MADE AND ENTERED THIS 30 of August, 1976, in Upshur County, Texas, Wood County, Texas, and Marion County, Texas, and the Clerk of the District Court in each County is directed to enter this Order of the Civil Minutes of the 115th Judicial District Court of his County.
