Motion was made by Charles Still, seconded by Bernice Nobles to approve a Special Road Use Agreement with Texas Oil & Gas Corp. on Pin Oak Road. Motion carried. (Copy attached.)

Motion was made by Charles Still, seconded by Floyd Drennon to approve a permit application from Artie House to place a driveway culvert on ROW of Persimmon Road. Motion carried. (Copy attached.)

Motion was made by Charles Still, seconded by Floyd Drennon, to approve a permit from Union Grove Water Supply, to make six (6) road crossings with water lines on Silk Tree Road. Motion carried. (Copy attached.)

SPECIAL ROAD USE AGREEMENT CONTRACT

THE STATE OF TEXAS |
COUNTY OF UPSHUR | KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS

The undersigned, TEXAS OIL & GAS CORP.,
hereinafter referred to as First Party, enters into and makes
an agreement with Upshur County Commissioner of Precinct No. 3,
Upshur County, Texas, and in order to get material to market
it is necessary to use a portion of Upshur County roads located
in Precinct No. 3, over which Commissioner has jurisdiction
and obligation to maintain in good repair and both parties
being aware of possible damage to said roads as a result of
hauling on and over same enter into the following agreement.

1.

First Party agrees to use only that section of
(describe road) Approx 1-5/8 mi. of Pin Oak Road off FM 1404.

2.

First Party agrees to use its vehicles in such a
manner as not to block or interfere with other traffic on said
road so that said road will be open to travel by the public
at all times.

3.

First Party agrees to grade, maintain and otherwise
repair said road using its own equipment, labor and materials,
if any needed, during the duration of time that First Party
is removing oilfield equipment from its lands located
in Precinct No. 3, Upshur County.

4.

First Party agrees to put said road back into the
same condition as it was prior to the commencement of hauling
operations on the part of First Party.

5.

First Party agrees to post surety bond in the amount of none to Upshur County Commissioners Court to insure performance of agreement.

6.

Nothing herein shall be construed as a waiver by the Commissioner of the authority granted him by Article 6716, V.A.C.S., but the rights and authority granted the Commissioner by the terms of Article 6716, V.A.C.S. are expressly reserved by the Commissioner in the event First Party fails to abide by the conditions above set forth.

UPSHUR COUNTY SENIOR CITIZENS MINI-BUS

UPSHUR CITIZENS COMMITTEE

IN

COOPERATION WITH UPSHUR COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' COURT

1. The Upshur County Senior Citizens' mini-bus would be a transportation service without charge to senior citizens sixty (60) years and older, regardless of socio-economic levels, race, color, sex, religion, or National origin. Persons using the service would receive transportation from their home or community location to medical facilities, shopping area, utility offices, banks, Post Office, consulting agencies and legal services and be returned to the same location. If these vital services were not used at a specific time, the bus would be available for educational and recreational purposes.

Two buses would operate on a five (5) day schedule throughout the County and be driven by qualified drivers. The Upshur County Transportation Committee, comprised of Upshur County residents, under the supervision of the Commissioners' Court, will assume the responsibility for the day-to-day operation of the mini-bus.

The first bus will be used to establish the routes and prove the need for a mini-bus in Upshur County. The second bus will be utilized to expand the routes when demand is great enough. When not in scheduled use, the buses would be available for educational and recreational purposes, upon the approval of the transportation committee.

2. The service would operate for Upshur County citizens throughout the County. Trips outside of the County would be by special approval by the citizens committee.
3. According to the 1970 census, 3,069 persons in the County were age sixty (60) years and older. This number is continually growing. Of this number qualifying for the service, we hope to serve at least 300 of these persons the first year.
4. Other agencies to be involved in the project include the Department of Human Resources, Social Security Administration, Texas Agricultural Extension

Service, Upshur County Chamber of Commerce, and City Governments located in the County. Community contacts, Civic Clubs and news media would help publicize the availability of the service.

5. BUDGET: \$18,000.00 Two 15 passenger buses
10,400.00 Salaries for regular drivers or substitutes
7,040.00 Operating expenses, insurance and miscellaneous expenses

- \$35,440.00 Total Proposed Budget

6. The County Commissioners' Court would assume the 10% cash and/or in-kind match of funds to include storage, maintenance, Administrative cost, County insurance, and possible manpower employment of drivers.
7. The transportation service would be continued after the initial one year funding through financing support of the County Commissioners' Court, manpower employment of the drivers, and personal contributions by individuals and organized groups.

A P R O C L A M A T I O N

WHEREAS:

The East Texas Area Agency on Aging, a division of the East Texas Council of Governments (ETCOG), through the funding agency for Title III of the Older Americans Act, has available funds for transportation of senior citizens age sixty (60) years and over, and

WHEREAS:

An Upshur County Citizens Committee sees the need for a mini-bus transportation for the Upshur County older Americans without charge to these citizens, and

WHEREAS:

This Citizens Committee has formulated a transportation project proposal to facilitate this project.

BE IT RESOLVED:

This day that the Upshur County Commissioners' Court will be the contracting Agency and be responsible for the 10% cash and/or in-kind matching funds needed for the first year funding, provided the proposal is approved. The Court will also assist in continuing this service after the first year funding.
