COMMENTS AND APPEAL FROM COMMISSIONERS COURT OF UPSHUR COUNTY,
TEXAS

TO

RAILROAD COMMISSION OF TEXAS

Gentlemen:

The Commissioners Court of Upshur County, Texas wishes to go on record as being in opposition to the recinding of the Bonus Allowable Rule used in the East Texas oil field.

It is believed the oil recovered pays the cost of salt water injected. This Rule if recinded would leave hugh amounts of oil in the field never to be recovered. For economic reasons production of all marginal wells would cease. The injection practice encourages a more complete pollution control program.

The Court feels that the discontinuation of this rule would cause a loss of tax revenue to our cities, our counties, and our schools. This loss would place an additional tax burden on other taxpayers.

The Court, also, feels there would be a number of jobs terminated were this Rule eliminated, contributing to our unemployment rate.

The Commissioners Court of Upshur County ask the Railroad Commission to consider the many factors involved and not recind the bonus allowable Rule for the East Texas field.
