



# UPSHUR COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT

GILMER, TEXAS

August 10, 1981

Commissioners Court met in a Regular Session with Judge Dean absent. Commissioner Charles Still presided.

The minutes of the July 20, 1981 meeting were read by Charles Still. The motion was made by J. W. Meadows and seconded by Delmo Lawson to let the minutes stand approved as read. Motion carried.

A representative of Blue Cross-Blue Shield, Miss Rebecca Karkaska, met with the court to discuss a dental insurance policy. There was no action taken at this time.

Bybee Weisinger met with the court to discuss a public hearing to be held in three or four months on the widening and rebuilding of Hwy. 259 from Diana to the Gregg County line. There will also be a discussion on curb & gutter and purchasing of highway right of ways.

Mr. U. D. Tatum met with the court asking why the road to his property became a #2 road. After a lengthy discussion he was told by the court that the only way this road could be discontinued as a county road would be for a petition to be written and signed by all the people who use this road stating there was no need for this road to be a public road.

The motion was made by J. W. Meadows, seconded by Floyd Drennan for Judge Dean or any other member of the court to attend a hearing (expense paid) in Throckmorton County concerning the mineral rights of Upshur County school land in case #2638 of that court to be heard August 14, 1981. Motion carried.

Court closed for an executive session.

Court reopened.

Upshur County Sheriff, Dale Jewkes, met with the court to explain the House Bill 1617 (Article 3926a) passed by the 67th Legislature authorizing Commissioners Court of each county to set reasonable fees to be charged for services by the Offices of Sheriffs and Constables. He was told by the court he would be placed on the agenda and notified at a later date for another discussion.



MEMO

TO: COUNTY JUDGES, SHERIFFS, DISTRICT & COUNTY CLERKS  
FROM: JEFF BOGGESS, TAC GENERAL COUNSEL  
RE: SHERIFF & CONSTABLE FEES

The 67th Legislature enacted H.B. 1617, which will permit a commissioners' court to set the fee to be paid in its county for service of citation in civil cases in order to have the fee equal the county's cost in effecting the service. The bill also permits the commissioners' court to set the fee to be paid sheriffs and constables for other services and repeals Article 3933a, V.A.T.S. This legislation becomes effective on September 1, 1981.

The bill also provides that if a commissioners' court takes no action the fees will remain as they were on August 31, 1981.

The Dallas County Commissioners' Court has adopted a written order establishing new fees for service of citations and writs. Enclosed please find a copy of this court order for your review. (Order sent to judges & clerks only.)

The TAC office will compile a list of all sheriff and constable fees charged in every county in the state. This list will be sent to every District and County Clerk in the State. Please provide us with information about all changes in the fees made by your commissioners' court by September 30, 1981 so that these changes will be reflected in our statewide list.

Since the legislation goes into effect September 1, we suggest that any change your court may adopt also become effective on September 1. Should your court desire to increase fees thereafter, we suggest that any increase be effective on September 1 of any future year so that we can have a uniform effective date across the state for such increases. This office will prepare a statewide list of all fees in September reflecting all new increases.

For each person, corporation or legal entity, on whom service of citation, subpoena, summons, or process not otherwise provided for, is performed or attempted and return made, including mileage, if any, the Sheriff and Constables shall receive a fee of:

Small Claims Courts	\$10.00
Justice Courts	\$15.00
All Other Courts	\$20.00

For executing or attempting to execute each writ of garnishment, injunction writ, distress warrant, writ of attachment, writ of sequestration, writ of execution, order of sale, writ of execution and order of sale, or writ not otherwise provided for, and making return thereon including mileage, if any, the Sheriff and Constables shall receive a fee of:

Small Claims Courts, Justice Courts, and All Other Courts	\$27.00

PROPERTY TAX BILL ALERT  
August 4, 1981

Rep. Wayne Peveto (D--Orange) introduced H.B. 30 to amend various provisions of the Property Tax Code enacted by the 66th Legislature in 1979. Following is a synopsis of provisions of H.B. 30 that are of particular interest to county officials.

THE HOUSE APPROVED H.B. 30 ON MONDAY, AUGUST 3, on a vote taken at 8 p.m., after approving some 18 proposed amendments to the bill and decisively defeating others.  
**DEFEATED:** (1) several different plans providing for the election and/or appointment of appraisal board members, (2) a plan to elect chief appraisers, (3) an amendment striking the language in Peveto's bill to make taxing units political subdivisions of the state, and (4) an attempt to designate the county tax assessor-collector the chief appraiser of an appraisal district.

**ACCEPTED:** (1) an amendment by Rep. Bob McFarland that guts the 3/4 rule by prohibiting reductions in the weighted voting strength of a taxing unit for board election purposes without the consent of the affected unit. Ex.: a large school district in an appraisal district levies 60% of the taxes in the district and has 60% of the voting strength. A 3/4 majority of the taxing units in a district could not impose a reduction of the voting strength upon the school district without its consent, and (2) extension of ad valorem tax exemptions to the tools, equipment, books and apparatus used by an individual, not a partnership or corporation, in his or her trade or profession.

The Senate Finance Committee on Monday, August 3 okayed a committee substitute to Sen. Pete Snelson's S.J.R. 4, a proposed constitutional amendment which would reimpose a 3¢ state ad valorem tax to finance building programs at Texas colleges and universities.

A survey taken by the Texas Association of Counties last week shows that such a tax, when levied on property assessed and appraised at 100% market value, would increase tax collections for state purposes by nearly 45% over 1979 levels.

From some approximately 135 responses that were mailed to TAC within a day or two of their receipt by county tax collector-assessors, we were able to prepare a report and present it to the Governor by the end of last week. Governor Clements opposes the 3¢ tax.

Billed by proponents as a "reduction" in state ad valorem taxes, the 3¢ authorization is actually a new state tax which would put local governments and the state in direct competition for tax dollars. If you oppose such a measure, call or write your state senators and representatives immediately.

Thank-you to all the tax assessor-collectors who responded immediately and effectively to our questionnaire on the effects of this proposed tax. You may wish to submit to your local media data on the effect of the 3¢ tax on your county.


