

UPSHUR COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT
GILMER, TEXAS

February 8, 1982

Commissioners Court met in Regular Session with all members present.

Judge Dean read the minutes of the January 25, 1982 meeting. Motion by J. W. Meadows seconded by Delmo Lawson to approve the minutes as read. Motion carried.

Mr. Fondley Tucker and Mr. Miller met with the Court concerning the closing of Pecan Road, a County Road in Pct. 4. According to Mr. Tucker and the Court records of July 14, 1969, the Court voted to close this road to the North East Corner of Fendley Tucker's property. The closing of the road resulted from an agreement between Fendley Tucker, George Bane, and then Pct. 3 Commissioner, F. L. Fannin. Mr. Miller, who recently purchased the Bane property said that he had done so with the assumption that the road was located on his property and belonged to him. He felt that he had the right to close the road South of Mr. Tucker, closing Mr. Tucker's entry to his property. Mr. Miller asked the Court to rescind the ruling of July 14, 1969. Commissioner Still stated that according to State Law, a County Road cannot be closed if it leads to a cemetery or if it provides access to other property in which the owner does not wish to be closed. Judge Dean stated that he felt there was an agreement in 1969, and that he thought the Court should uphold the action taken in 1969. Orvil Lindsey and Mr. Harding adjacent property owners, also presented their views and suggestions concerning the road. Motion was made by Judge Dean seconded by Charles Still to abide by the Court Minutes of July 14, 1969. Motion carried. Copy of the July 14, 1969 minutes are on file in Vol. 14, Page 471 of the Upshur County Commissioners Court Minutes.

County Agent, Glenn Aubrey met with the Court to discuss the fire ant problem in the County. Aubrey explained a program offered by the Texas Department of Agricultural for the distribution of ground bait to fight the problem. The County pays a portion of the costs and is reimbursed by the property owners who wish to purchase the bait. It was suggested that Mr. Aubrey run an advertisement in the local paper to try and get a response from property owners who would be interested, so as to get an idea of how much of the bait to purchase. The Court plans to make a decision on this at the February 22, 1982 meeting.

Bob Arnold, Certified Public Accountant, with Oakerson, Arnold & Co. gave his report on the audit just finished by his firm. Arnold said that his company found Keith Barber's figures accurate. He stated that his firm spent more time on internal control regarding what should be employed in the future along with what already is being done. A copy of the letter from Mr. Arnold along with his suggestions are attached in these minutes.

Dale Jewkes met with the Court concerning the County's Crime Watch Program. He stated that he was out of crime watch signs and running short on other supplies. He suggested to the Court that the County purchase signs for resale to communities. No action was taken at this time.

Dale Jewkes also spoke to the Court concerning the jail facilities and the letter expected from the State concerning the overcrowded jail. Jewkes suggested that the Judge appoint a committee of himself, the Commissioners, and some outsiders to study the problem and offer their suggestions for a solution. He also stated that he would probably be going over his budget because of some changes that had been made in the jail. No action was taken at this time.

Motion by Delmo Lawson seconded by J. W. Meadows to pay County Employees on the 26th of February. Motion carried.

Motion by Delmo Lawson seconded by J. W. Meadows to appoint Kenneth Winn the new election judge for box 18. Motion carried.

Motion by Floyd Drennan seconded by Charles Still to place in the minutes a letter from the Harrison County Juvenile Center expressing their appreciation for the County's funding of the Juvenile Center. Motion carried. Copy attached.

Motion by Delmo Lawson seconded by J. W. Meadows to place the letter of Certification from Judge Mulanax stating that the Upshur County Jail is suitable for a Juvenile Detention Facility. Motion carried. Copy attached.

Motion by Floyd Drennan seconded by Charles Still to approve a Permit Application by Walter Durning to place a culvert within the ROW of Cougar Road. Motion carried. Copy attached.

Motion by Floyd Drennan seconded by Charles Still to approve a Special Road Use Agreement Contract by Wood County Timber Co. for use of Jaguar & Groundhog Roads. Motion carried. Copy attached.

Motion by Delmo Lawson seconded by J. W. Meadows to approve a Permit Application by Jean M. Wilcox to place a driveway within the ROW of Silk Tree Road. Motion carried. Copy attached.

Motion by Delmo Lawson seconded by J. W. Meadows to approve a Permit Application by Bi-County Water Supply Corp. to place a 1 inch water line within the ROW of (Shelton Lake Road) Skylark Road. Motion carried. Copy attached. *Delmo Lawson*

Motion by Delmo Lawson seconded by J. W. Meadows to advertise for bids on a new tractor. Motion carried. *Five Seams*

Motion by J. W. Meadows seconded by Delmo Lawson for the County Judge and Commissioners to attend a meeting in College Station, February 16-19. Motion carried.

Judge Dean gave a report on the law suit filed in Federal Court by Jesse Mae Shelton against the County. Ms. Shelton filed for Permanate Injunction against the County. Judge Dean stated that he had turned the case over to District Attorney, Dwight Brannon.

Motion by Charles Still seconded by Floyd Drennan to approve payment on three ROW deeds from the names listed below. Motion carried.

Gentlemen:

In connection with our recent examination of the financial statements of Upshur County, Texas, for the year ended September 30, 1981, we reviewed the accounting procedures and related internal control. This review is made as the basis for determining the scope of our audit.

This letter contains our suggestions for improving accounting procedures and internal control; however, it should not be considered as all-inclusive of areas where improvements might be made.

We shall be pleased to discuss these suggestions in greater detail and assist you with their implementation.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Our observations and recommendations concerning overall county financial operations are listed below.

INSURANCE AND BONDS

We recommend a periodic review of insurance coverage and that this review be made a part of the minutes of the commissioners' court. We also recommend that bond coverage of county officials be reviewed periodically to determine adequacy of bonding.

C.D. AND INVESTMENT REGISTER

We recommend that the county treasurer maintain a C.D. and investment register. This register should contain detailed information concerning county investments and earnings thereon.

BANK ACCOUNTS

The county auditor should have all bank statements related to county business periodically made available for review. County officials should be responsible for making the county auditor aware of all new accounts, any closed accounts, and all existing accounts.

DEBT REGISTER

We recommend that the county maintain a debt register. This register should contain detailed information concerning county related long-term and short-term borrowings, repayment schedules, and interest costs.

PAID INVOICES

We recommend that all invoices bear evidence that the merchandise was received.

VEHICLE MAINTENANCE REGISTER

We recommend that over a period of time, the precinct officials develop and maintain vehicle maintenance records.

FIXED ASSET RECORDS

We recommend that detailed fixed asset records be completed as soon as is practical.

We appreciate the efforts of the county auditor regarding internal controls and it is evident that progress has been made and continues.

We wish to thank county employees for the cooperation given us during this audit.

We have examined the financial statements listed in the Table of Contents of Upshur County, Texas, for the year ended September 30, 1981. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

As described in Note 1, Upshur County's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements; consequently, revenues (receipts) and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and expenses (disbursements) are recognized when paid rather than when a liability is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements are not intended to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly the assets and liabilities arising from cash transactions of the various funds of Upshur County at September 30, 1981, and its revenues collected and expenditures paid during the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1, which basis has been applied in a manner consistent with that of the preceding year.

In connection with our examination, we also made a study and evaluation of the system of internal accounting control, performed tests of compliance with the Revenue Sharing and Antirecession Fiscal Assistance Acts and regulations as required by Sections II.C.3. and III.C.3. of the Audit Guide and Standards for Revenue Sharing and Antirecession Fiscal Assistance Fund Recipients (Guide) issued by the office of Revenue Sharing, U.S. Department of the Treasury and compared the data on Bureau of Census Form RS-9 to records of the County of Upshur as required by Section II.C.4. of the "Guide".


