TO ALL COUNTY JUDGES AND COMMISSIONERS

Several weeks ago I wrote you regarding the need for the increase in fees for the handling of certificates of title as well as tax certificates.

As I stated in my previous letter, our investigation reveals that the fees received for the services are not adequate for handling these items and need to be increased.

The County Clerks have been successful in increasing their fees adequately, and we feel that we should make every effort to do so in 1983.

Attached herewith are the two bills which were drawn by The Texas Legislative Council, and we hope to have them introduced at the next Session of the Legislature.

ENCLOSED IS A COPY OF A RESOLUTION CONCERNING COLLECTIONS WHICH WAS UNANIMOUSLY ADOPTED AT THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE COUNTY TAX ASSESSOR-COLLECTOR'S ASSOCIATION OF TEXAS IN ABILENE IN MAY.

The majority of the County Tax Assessors and Collectors of Texas believe that if the time comes for centralizing collections that due consideration should be given to placing this function in the County Tax Office. Of course, there are many jurisdictions that will want to do their own collecting, and this is rightly so, but we do believe that we should offer our services.

We hope we will have an opportunity to present our views at the TAC Meeting in Austin next week.

2 relating to the fee for a new or reissued certificate of title to a

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 57, Certificate of Title Act (Article
6 6687-1, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended to read as
7 follows:

8 Sec. 57. (a) Each applicant for a Certificate of Title or
9 reissuance thereof shall pay to the designated agent (County Tax
10 Assessor-Collector) the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10) [~~Three--Dollars~~
11 ~~(\$3)~~], of which the first Five Dollars (\$5) [~~One-Dollar-and-Fifty~~
12 ~~Cents--(\$1.50)~~] shall be accounted for by the County Tax
13 Assessor-Collector and disposed of in the method hereinafter
14 provided; and the remaining Five Dollars (\$5) [~~One-Dollar-and-Fifty~~
15 ~~Cents--(\$1.50)~~] shall be forwarded to the State Department of
16 Highways and Public Transportation for deposit in the State Highway
17 Fund, together with the application for a Certificate of Title,
18 within twenty-four hours after the same has been received by the
19 County Tax Assessor-Collector, from which fees the Department shall
20 be entitled and shall use sufficient money to pay all expenses
21 necessary to efficiently administer and perform the duties set
22 forth herein.

23 (b) The County Tax Assessor-Collector may defer remittance

AN ACT

2 relating to the fee charged for an ad valorem tax certificate.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Section 31.08(a), Tax Code, is amended to read as
5 follows:

6 (a) At the request of any person, a collector for a taxing
7 unit shall issue a certificate showing the amount of delinquent
8 taxes, penalties, and interest due the unit on a property according
9 to the unit's current tax records. The collector shall charge a
10 fee of \$10 [~~\$2~~] for each certificate issued. The collector shall
11 pay all fees collected under this section into the treasury of the
12 taxing unit that employs him.

13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 1983.

14 SECTION 3. The importance of this legislation and the
15 crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an
16 emergency and an imperative public necessity that the
17 constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several
18 days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended.

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, County Tax Offices of the State of Texas presently collect and assess ad valorem taxes for County and State purposes;

WHEREAS, these offices are constitutionally authorized to perform these functions,

WHEREAS, these County Offices are presently equipped and staffed to perform all collection functions,

WHEREAS, it would cost the taxpayers of this State large amounts of tax dollars to duplicate the existing systems which have already been established,

WHEREAS, The County Tax Offices are the only county-wide collection offices in the State,

WHEREAS, it would be more efficient and economical to maintain the county offices in this capacity than to create new offices to perform the services that are already presently available;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the County Tax Office be designated as the principal collection office, if other taxing jurisdictions "elect" to discontinue their particular collection function.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be forwarded to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, all members of the State Legislature and to all Commissioner's Courts in the State of Texas.

THE ABOVE RESOLUTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY ADOPTED ON MAY 18, 1982, AT THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE TAX ASSESSOR-COLLECTOR'S ASSOCIATION OF TEXAS IN ABILENE, TEXAS.
