# UPSHUR COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT

HILMER, TEXAS

Sept. 19, 1983

Commissioners Court met in Special Session with all members of the court present.

Judge Dean announced that there were five bids on the telephone system and that the reading of the minutes of the last meeting would be dispensed with until the bids were opened.

Keith Barber, County Auditor, requested a delay on bids for Liability Insurance until the October meeting.

The microphone system for the courtroom was discussed and a demonstration will be held on Thursday morning, Sept. 22, 1983.

Judge Dean read the minutes of the meeting of Sept. 12, 1983. Delmo Lawson made a motion that the minutes stand approved as read. Motion seconded by J. W. Meadows. Motion carried.

Judge Dean announced that he had a letter from J. B. Hill, Jr., County Clerk, stating that nominees for the Appraisal District Board must be in by Oct. 15, 1983.

Motion by Delmo Lawson and seconded by J. W. Meadows to approve a Permit Application to Ftex Telephone Cooperative, Inc., to place a buried telephone cable within the ROW of Zennie (Old County Line or Caudle Rd.) Motion carried; copy attached.

Motion by Delmo Lawson and seconded by J. W. Meadows to approve an Interlocal agreement with the City of East Mountain. Motion carried. Copy attached.

Motion by Charles Still and seconded by Delmo Lawson to approve a Permit Application by Nora Fontaine to place a culvert installation within the ROW of Aspen Trail. Motion carried. Copy attached.

Motion by Delmo Lawson and seconded by Charles Still to approve a Permit Application by Steve Davis to place a driveway culvert within the ROW of Rail Road. Motion approved. Copy attached.

Motion by Charles Still and seconded by Paul Davis to approve a Permit Application by Robert Riegel to place a culvert installation within the ROW of Aspen Trail. Motion approved. Copy attached.

Motion by Charles Still and seconded by Delmo Lawson to approve a Permit Application by Travis Weathers to place a culvert installation within the ROW of Aspen Road. Motion carried. Copy attached.

Motion by Paul Davis and seconded by Delmo Lawson to approve the purchase of three loads of oil dirt by New Diana School to repair pot holes and driveway entrance to parking lot. The school will pay for three loads and return one load to the county in exchange for county employees spreading the dirt. Motion carried. Copy attached.

Motion made by Paul Davis and seconded by Charles Still to accept, with the District Attorney's approval, the proposal from Westwind Exploration to amend the lease held by the County to read the same as theirs. Motion carried.

Judge Dean reported an order from Judge Mulanax filed in the District Clerks office setting the salary as of Jan. 1, 1984 of Judicial Court Reporter of the 115th Judicial Court at \$27,951.00. Motion by Judge Dean to place order in minutes of Commissioners Court. Motion died for lack of second. No action taken.

Motion by Charles Still and seconded by Delmo Lawson for contract with Henson Asphalt Paving and Charles Still for labor and equipment for work to be done on Montgomery Street. Motion carried.

Motion by Charles Still and seconded by Delmo Lawson to send Micheal Smith, County Tax Assessor/Collector, to seminar in College Station Nov. 15-17, 1983. Motion carried.

Judge Dean read a letter from Southwest Insurance of Austin on accident prevention, with recommendation to appoint loss control coordinator. Motion by Charles Still and seconded by J. W. Meadows to appoint Keith Barber. Motion carried.

Motion by J. W. Meadows and seconded by Delmo Lawson to approve unpaid bills. Motion carried. Copy attached.

Keith Barber, County Auditor, reported on proposal from Ray and Associates. A copy was submitted to the court.


Motion by Charles Still and seconded by Delmo Lawson to put Depository Contract in court minutes. Motion carried. Copy attached.

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into on this the 25th day April, A.D. 1983, between UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS acting by and through EVERETT DEAN, County Judge, hereinafter called the COUNTY; and, GILMER NATIONAL BANK, Gilmer, Texas, acting by and through its President, MAX McPEEK, hereinafter called the BANK, WITNESSETH:

CONTENTS OF AGREEMENT

I. DEPOSITORY

Gilmer National Bank does hereby agree to maintain all accounts of the County according to the wishes and desires of the County, or its proper and legally designated representative or representatives, in compliance with all the provisions of the laws of the State of Texas relating to the County fund depositories.

In this connection, it is expressly understood that the County shall have the power to determine and designate the character and amount of County funds which shall be "demand deposits" and what character and amount of funds shall be "time deposits". The County shall have the right to withdraw any amount of funds of the County that are deposited in the depository and that are not required immediately to pay obligations of the County or required to be kept on deposit under the terms of this contract and invest those funds in direct debt securities of the United States.

The County may maintain Super NOW accounts per the guidelines established by the Depository Institutions Deregulation Committee's final rule of January 5, 1983, 12 C.F.R. Part 1204.

II. SECURITIES PLEDGE

The Bank shall pledge acceptable securities in compliance with the Statutes of the State of Texas in an amount determined by the County as necessary in securing any and all deposits of the County's funds. It is agreed that the County shall reserve the right to alter from time to time the required amount of securities to be sufficiently adequate to protect said funds and to approve or reject the securities so pledged. It is further understood that the Bank shall have the right and privilege of substituting securities upon obtaining approval of the County, provided the total amount of securities deposited is adequate under the law.

The funds covered by this contract include all those funds under the hand of the County Treasurer, including the Permanent and Available School Funds; funds in the hands of all officials of Upshur County acting in their official capacity, including the trust funds in the hands of the County and District Clerks.

III. RATE GUARANTEE

Certificates of \$100,000 or more will pay the same rate as that paid for \$10,000 money market securities for 26 weeks. This rate, according to Regulation Q, will be one-quarter per cent above the rate for United States Treasury Bills immediately prior to the date deposit or certificate. It shall be binding only until the maturity of the certificate.

The interest rate for time deposits under \$100,000 shall be the maximum rate offered according to Regulation Q at the time the deposit or certificate is written. It shall be binding only until the maturity of the certificate.

The Super NOW account interest rate shall be the same as the rate of the 91 day Treasury Bill less one per cent.

IV. OTHER SERVICES

The Bank agrees to furnish deposit slips for all the accounts, money bags and a monthly bank statement on each account, without charge to the County. The Bank will also act as paying agent for principal and/or interest on County bonds without charge. The Bank will furnish bags and keys as needed for night depository without cost to the County. The Bank will handle all County accounts in accordance with generally accepted banking practice.

Other service charges to be paid by the County will be those established by the Bank.

V. LOANS

The rate of interest charged the County for loans shall be determined by the Bank.

This contract shall remain in force until such time as the Commissioners Court of Upshur County deems it advisable or until the time fixed for selection of a depository, the regular February term, 1985.






