She said she would select the one she thinks is best for the position and bring her to court for the court's approval. Tony Douglas told the court that he is afraid that if they do not fill the vacancy soon, the state will take the money appropriated for this and put it elsewhere. Randy Reeves, Upshur County Extension Agent, stated that he gets requests at times that he can not help the people with because it is outside his field. No action taken at this time.

Several people from the Justice Center met with the court to discuss placing a ban on smoking in all county buildings. Carolyn Perry stated that the deputies and jurors smoke in the lobby because there is no smoking in the offices. She said she puts signs up every day and they are taken down. Jo Ann Stocks stated that she puts signs up in front of her office thanking people for not smoking. Mary Brunson said there are places under the trees outside the Justice Center that people can go smoke under. She also stated that perhaps if this is enforced more people will quit smoking. Motion by David Loyd seconded by Tommy Eatherton to pass this rule. This will go into effect June 1, 1993 and will affect all buildings owned by the county. Motion carried, with Tommy Stanley voting no.

Motion by Gaddis Lindsey seconded by Tommy Stanley to buy the used reclaimer that had been bid on earlier. This is on the condition that the test planned for tomorrow goes well. Motion carried.




