UPSHUR COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S COURT

4-28-1997

Commissioner's Court met in Special Session. All members present.

1. Motion by Tommy Stanley seconded by Rick Jackson to approve minutes of previous meetings dated 4-14-1997. Motion carried.
2. Motion by Gaddis Lindsey seconded by Rick Jackson to approve budget amendments as presented by County Auditor. Motion carried. Copy attached.
3. Motion by Tommy Stanley seconded by Gaddis Lindsey to approve payment of bills as presented by County Treasurer. Motion carried. Copy attached.
4. Motion by Tommy Stanley seconded by Gaddis Lindsey to approve the following payroll changes: Billy Joe Williams-due to introductory period ending and Codi Bishop-due to 6 month probation period ending. Motion carried. Copies attached.
5. Steve Murry from Coley Funeral Home and Larry Tave from Turner Brothers Funeral Home met with Court to discuss indigent burial (Tabled from previous meeting) Court had previously asked Mr Murry to submit proposal for indigent burial. Mr. Murry stated Court should establish guidelines concerning who would qualify for indigent burial. Mr. Murry suggested County establish a county cemetery for the sole purpose of the burial space for a person who meets the requirements for Indigent burial. Motion by Gaddis Lindsey seconded by Kenney Thompson to approve the county paying up to an amount not to exceed \$795 00 to pay for the cost of having the human remains cremated or a direct burial and to pay up to an amount not to exceed \$200 00 to have a grave open and closed for same. Court stated these were the only two items that were being established as county policy for indigent people who reside in Upshur County or unidentifiable human remains. Any other items or procedures would be considered at a later date. Motion carried. Copy of proposals submitted by Steve Murry attached.

Commissioner Thompson stated that he will accept the best bid, not necessarily the lowest. He will accept best bid for the County per dollar.



**FUNERALS FOR INDIGENTS
IN UPSHUR COUNTY**

The following is a proposal for the final disposition of the Indigent people who reside in Upshur County or unidentifiable human remains.

1. The county will pay up to an amount not to exceed \$795.00 to pay for the cost of having the human remains cremated or a direct burial.
2. The county will pay up to an amount not to exceed \$200.00 to have a grave open and closed in a designated space as set fourth by the county.
3. The county shall established a county cemetery for the sole purpose of the burial space for a person who meets the requirements for Indigent burial. The cemetery is for indigents only.
4. The funeral home that is notified will make the removal of the body and prepare it for either cremation or direct burial. The funeral home will notify the county and the county will determine if the deceased person meets the requirement set forth for Indigent Funerals.

The cemetery shall be established and governed as follows:

- A. The property used for the cemetery shall be deeded, plotted, and recorded in the County Clerks office as set forth by the prevailing laws of the State of Texas.
- B. The individual spaces will be marked by number only.
- C. The records shall be kept by the County Clerk.
- D. The records kept shall include the following:
 1. The date the remains are received.
 2. The date the remains are interred.
 3. The name and age of the person interred if those facts can be conveniently obtained and,
 4. The number of the space in which the remains are interred.

I am writing this letter as a result of an office conference with Ray Roeder, County Buildings Supervisor, Randy Hill, Gilmer Fire Marshal and Chris Gray, Project Manager, Universal Time Equipment.

During the conference we discussed certain requirements that could be delayed until September, 2005; however, the fire alarm system for the elevator was to be installed in 1997.

ASME A17.1 Section 211.3b covering smoke detectors shall be in accordance with National Fire Protection Association, (NFPA) 72, which does not address a partial smoke detector (Fire Alarm System) system. This office recommends that the county install a complete fire alarm system, as well as an emergency lighting system for corridors, stairs, and rest rooms for the safety of employees and the general public conducting business during court sessions. The emergency lighting system is not intended to light the entire courthouse, just the means of egress for at least 90 minutes.

RULES OF PROCEDURE, CONDUCT AND DECORUM
AT MEETINGS OF THE
UPSHUR COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S COURT

- I. All Regular, Special, Emergency and Executive Session Meetings of the Upshur County Commissioner's Court will be called and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Government Code.
- II. Regular, Special, and Emergency Meetings of the Upshur County Commissioner's Court are open to the public and to representatives of the press and media. Executive Sessions of the Commissioner's Court are not open to the public, the press or the media and only those individuals expressly requested or ordered to be present are allowed to attend Executive Session.
- III. The Upshur County Commissioner's Court meets in Regular Session on the second and fourth Monday of each month, and the last working day of each month unless otherwise approved at a previous Commissioner's Court meeting. In order for a matter or issue to appear as an agenda item on the Agenda of any Regular Meeting of the Commissioner's Court, a request must be filed with and approved by at least one member of the Commissioner's Court and/or the County Judge by 12:00 p.m. (noon) on the Wednesday immediately preceding the next Regular Meeting of the Commissioner's Court.
- IV. The business of Upshur County is conducted by and between the members of the Upshur County Commissioner's Court and by those members of the County staff, elected officials, department heads, consultants, experts and/or members of the public requested to be present and participate. While the public is invited to attend all meetings of the Commissioner's Court (except Executive Sessions) the public's participation therein is limited to that of observers unless a member (or members) of the public is requested to address the Commissioner's Court on a particular issue (or issues) or unless the member (or members) of the public completes a Public Participation Form and submits same to the County Clerk prior to the time the agenda item (or items) is addressed by the Court. A sample of the Upshur County Commissioner's Court Public

Participation Form is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

- A. Each member of the public who appears before the Commissioner's Court shall be limited to a maximum of five (5) minutes to make his/her remarks. Time for each speaker shall be maintained by the County Clerk or such other designated representative of the Commissioner's Court.
- B. Maximum discussion on any agenda item, regardless of the number of members of the public wishing to address the Commissioner's Court on such agenda item (or items), shall be limited to thirty (30) minutes. In the event that more than six (6) members of the public wish to address a particular agenda item (or items), then only the first six (6) speakers will be recognized. To the extent possible, the six (6) members of the public recognized to speak shall be divided equally between those members of the public wishing to speak for the agenda item (or items) and those members of the public wishing to speak against the agenda item (or items).
- C. In matters of exceptional interest, the Court may, by the majority vote of the members of the Court in attendance at the meeting, either shorten or lengthen the time allocated for a particular member of the public, all members of the public and/or the amount of time allocated for all agenda items and/or a specific agenda item.
- D. It is the intention of the Court to provide an open access to the citizens of Upshur County to address the Commissioner's Court and express themselves on issues of County Government. Members of the public are reminded that the Upshur County Commissioner's Court is a constitutional Court, with both judicial and legislative powers, created under Article V, Section 1 and Section 18 of the Texas Constitution. As a Constitutional Court, the Upshur County Commissioner's Court also possesses the power to issue a Contempt of Court Citation under Section 81.024 of the Texas Local Government Code. Accordingly, members of the public in attendance at any Regular, Special, and/or Emergency Meeting of the Court shall conduct themselves with proper respect and decorum

in speaking to, and/or addressing the Court; in participating in public discussion before the Court; and in all actions in the presence of the Court. Proper attire for men, women, and children is mandatory. Those members of the public who are inappropriately attired and/or who do not conduct themselves in an orderly and appropriate manner will be ordered to leave the meeting. Refusal to abide by the Court's Order and/or continued disruption of the meeting may result in a Contempt of Court Citation.

E. It is not the intention of the Upshur County Commissioner's Court to provide a public forum for the demeaning of any individual or group. Neither is it the intention of the Court to allow a member (or members) of the public to insult the honesty and/or integrity of the Court, as a body, or any member or members of the Court, individually or collectively. Accordingly, profane, insulting or threatening language directed toward the Court and/or racial, ethnic, or gender slurs or epithets will not be tolerated. Violation of these rules may result in the following sanctions:

1. cancellation of a speaker's remaining time;
2. removal from the Commissioner's Courtroom;
3. a Contempt Citation; and/or
4. such other civil and/or criminal sanctions as may be authorized under the Constitution, Statutes and Codes of the State of Texas.

V. The County Judge is the presiding officer of the Upshur County Commissioner's Court and is a fully participating member thereof. In the event of the absence of the County Judge, the senior member of the Commissioner's Court (in terms of total number of years as an elected representative) present at the Regular, Special, Emergency Session, shall serve as the Judge Pro-Tem of the Court. However, nothing herein shall prevent the senior member of this Commissioner's Court from delegating this duty to another member of the Commissioner's Court.

VI. The County Judge (or the designated Judge Pro-Tem of the Commissioner's Court), as presiding officer of the Commissioner's Court, is responsible for conducting all meetings, and members of the public who have properly completed a Public Participation Form and submitted same to the County Clerk must wait to be recognized before they will be allowed to address the Court.

VII. Special Rules for the Press and Media:

- A. No media personnel or equipment, including lights, cameras or microphones will be located on the Commissioner's Court bench nor closer than five feet (5') in the front of the Commissioner's Court bench.
- B. Reporters and media technicians are required to structure their movements, equipment set-up and take-down and adjustments, etc. in such a manner as to not disrupt the Commissioner's Court deliberations or the ability of the public to see, hear, and participate in the proceedings.
- C. Interviews shall not be conducted inside the Commissioner's Courtroom during the time the Court is in session.
- D. Media interviews which are conducted outside the Commissioner's Courtroom should be conducted in such a manner that the interview does not disturb, impede or disrupt the proceedings of any Regular, Special, Emergency and/or Executive Session Meeting of the Court.

VIII. The Sheriff of Upshur County, Texas, or his designated deputy shall serve as the Bailiff at all Regular, Special, and Emergency Meetings of the Court. However, in the event of the absence of the Sheriff, or in the event that there exists a conflict of interest between the Sheriff, any member of the Sheriff's Department, and the Commissioner's Court, or in the event of an Executive Session of the Court in which the Sheriff is not an authorized participant, then in such event, the Court shall appoint such other commissioned peace officers to serve as Bailiff as may be necessary.

- IX. From time to time, the Commissioner's Court shall conduct town meetings and public hearings. These rules of procedure, conduct and decorum shall also apply to such town meetings, and public hearings, however, the Commissioner's Court may adopt additional and supplemental rules for such meetings as may be necessary and appropriate to conduct such meetings in an orderly, efficient and proper manner
- X. These Rules of Procedure, Conduct, and Decorum at Meetings of the Upshur County Commissioner's Court shall be effective immediately upon adoption by the Court and shall remain in full force and effect until amended or repealed by a majority vote of the Commissioner's Court
