Section 3.07 of the 1993 amendatory act provides.

offense occurs before the effective date

Art. 102.017. Court Costs; Courthouse Security Fund; Municipal Court Building Security Fund

(a) A defendant convicted of a felony offense in a district court shall pay a \$5 security fee as a cost of court.

(b) A defendant convicted of a misdemeanor offense in a justice court, county court, county court at law, or district court shall pay a \$3 security fee as a cost of court. The governing body of a municipality by ordinance may create a municipal court building security fund and may require a defendant convicted of a misdemeanor offense in a municipal court to pay a \$3 security fee as a cost of court.

(c) In this article, a person is considered convicted if:

- (1) a sentence is imposed on the person,
- (2) the person receives community supervision, including deferred adjudication, or
- (3) the court defers final disposition of the person's case

(d) The clerks of the respective courts shall collect the costs and pay them to the county or municipal treasurer, as appropriate, or to any other official who discharges the duties commonly delegated to the county or municipal treasurer, as appropriate, for deposit in a fund to be known as the courthouse security fund or a fund to be known as the municipal court building security fund, as appropriate. A fund designated by this subsection may be used only to finance the following items when used for the purpose of providing security services for buildings housing a district, county, justice, or municipal court, as appropriate:

- (1) the purchase or repair of X-ray machines and conveying systems,
- (2) handheld metal detectors;
- (3) walkthrough metal detectors,
- (4) identification cards and systems;
- (5) electronic locking and surveillance equipment;
- (6) bailiffs, deputy sheriffs, deputy constables, or contract security personnel during times when they are providing appropriate security services,
- (7) signage,
- (8) confiscated weapon inventory and tracking systems;
- (9) locks, chains, or other security hardware, or
- (10) continuing education on security issues for court personnel and security personnel.

(e) The courthouse security fund shall be administered by or under the direction of the commissioners court. The municipal court building fund shall be administered by or under the direction of the governing body of the municipality
