



Commissioners Court of Upshur County:

CTI has operated the inmate phones in the Upshur County Jail for three years. During that time, CTI had no complaints from the Upshur County Sheriffs' Department. CTI personally recommended the Upshur County Sheriffs' Department to a private, family owned charity foundation for a grant. Through CT's efforts, the Upshur County Sheriffs' Department received a Fifteen Thousand Dollar (\$15,000.00) grant to purchase handguns for the Sheriffs' Department. This is verifiable through Robert Cromley of the Sheriffs' Department.

The only complaint CTI received in its three years of service to Upshur County was from a citizen of Upshur County that chose to file a frivolous lawsuit against CTI. This suit was dismissed by the District Court in Upshur County as being without merit. Although CTI spent a large amount of money defending itself, CTI chose not to pursue the parties responsible for CTI's expenses.

CTI has strived to be a dependable, professional vendor and a good corporate citizen to Upshur County.

If given the privilege to continue in the Upshur County Jail, CTI pledges to continue to provide prompt, courteous service to the Sheriffs' Department at all times going forward.

CTI INMATE PHONE AND SERVICE AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into this _____ day of _____, 2001, by and between Conversant Technologies, Inc. ("CTI"), a Texas corporation, with its principal office located at 2809 Regal Road, Suite 208, Plano, Texas 75075, and Upshur County Texas, with its principal office located at 405 North Titus Street, Gilmer, Texas 75644.

TERMS AND CONDITIONSTerm

The term of the agreement between Upshur County and CTI shall be for three (3) years from the date that Upshur County signs this agreement. Upshur County may at its option renew the agreement for one (1) two (2) year renewal period. In the event CTI is not notified ninety days prior to the expiration of the original term of the County's intent to seek other proposals, the renewal option will take effect.

Representations of Customer

Upshur County, by signing this agreement, represents to CTI that Upshur County has the right to enter into this agreement with CTI.

CTI Obligations

CTI will, at no cost to Upshur County, install inmate phones, any wiring or conduit that is required, state-of-the-art call processing equipment, a printer for Jail staff to review all calls, and a monitor. CTI shall arrange for the rental of local phone lines to complete calls from inmates at the County Jail. CTI shall arrange for training on the monitor for selected Jail staff. CTI shall also install a Personal Identification Number ("PIN") system to identify inmate calls to a specific inmate. This enables the Sheriffs' Department to investigate fraud, threats, and other crimes by inmates.

In addition, CTI shall install monitoring and recording equipment at the request of the Sheriff. This also enables the Sheriffs' Department to document inmates trying to use the phones for criminal activities.

Maintenance

CTI shall respond to any minor repair needs within twenty-four (24) hours Monday through Friday. CTI will respond to a major outage within three (3) hours of notification, seven days a week. A major outage is defined by twenty-five percent (25%) or more of the inmate phones being out of service.

Installation

CTI pledges all work will be done in a professional, timely and courteous manner during the entire agreement. The number of phones to be installed will be decided by the Sheriff. All equipment installed at the Upshur County Jail shall remain the property of CTI. All wiring and conduit installed at the Upshur County Jail shall become the property of Upshur County the day they are installed.

Commission

In consideration for Upshur County giving CTI the privilege to manage the inmate phones, CTI agrees to compensate Upshur County with the following commission:

Year One: Forty-five percent (45%) of gross billable revenue

Year Two:	Forty-six percent (46%) of gross billable revenue
Year Three:	Forty-seven percent (47%) of gross billable revenue
Years Four and Five:	Forty-eight percent (48%) of gross billable revenue

Gross billable revenue means all revenue generated by the inmates off of all completed calls. CTI cannot deduct any money for bad debt, fraud, line charges, long distances charges, clearinghouse fees - any fees at all.

Commission Payment

CTI shall begin paying monthly commission checks to Upshur County sixty days after the end of the first month that inmate traffic is carried from the Upshur County Jail.

Bonus or Equipment

It is CTI's policy not to offer counties a "bonus" or "free equipment". CTI believes that nothing of value is ever given for "free". Many counties in the past five years have fallen victim to "instant cash bonuses" and "free equipment" only to learn what they thought was "free" cost the County many times over during the life of the contract.

Local Collect Call: \$4.10
 Intralata/Intrastate Collect Call: See Rate Sheet
 Interstate Collect Call: \$3.50 surcharge plus \$.42 per minute

CTI agrees not to change any of its rates in this agreement without the written approval of Upshur County Commissioners Court.

The above terms and conditions constitute the entire agreement between CTI and Upshur County. Any terms or conditions that are to be added will be in writing, signed and dated by both parties. Any oral agreements shall be null and void.

Dear Ms. Long:

I am pleased to present you with our proposal to provide Inmate Telephone Equipment and service for the Upshur County, Texas, Jail, along with information on the equipment, designed, manufactured and maintained by Tel-Equip Labs, and Cannon Telephone Company, both located in Dallas, Texas.

We recommend the installation of the Cannon System ACP-9000 Inmate Telephone System, and with sufficient Phillips/ Brooks G0-5010 extensions that will allow each inmate easy and safe access to outbound collect call service. An agreement with Cannon includes:

- State-of-the-art technology, multi-lingual phones*
- Reasonable rates that are often over 50% lower than those charged by AT&T, Regional Bell Operating Companies and other inmate telephone service providers*
- Same-day response to all customer calls made to the Cannon 800 number before 5P, next morning to all others*
- Not more than one business day response to written or faxed inquiries from the facility management*
- Local, Upshur County area technicians on-call 24 hours a day*
- Verifiable commissions paid on the 15th day of each month*

Cannon offers this at no out-of-pocket cost to Upshur County. After reviewing local and intra-LATA rates published by the primary Local Exchange Carriers serving the area, and allowable long-distance rates on file with utility regulators, Cannon offers to pay an commission equal to not less than 40.125% of the gross billable rates generated from its

service to the facility without the "Hear-Say" full channel recording and monitoring system, or not less than 36.75% of the gross billable rates with the "Hear-Say" option and an on-site Terminal Operating Management System.

With an initial three (3) year agreement and a one (1) year renewal option, *these percentages will be paid before any deductions are made for non-collectibles and/or expenses.* The initial commission proposed by Cannon is approximately the same or higher than a Fifty Percent (50%) commission paid after deduction of all third party charges. Unlike many other companies that provide inmate telephone services, Cannon pays commissions on the gross billable rates before any deductions for local or long distance telephone expenses, bad debt, or costs of providing service. In our usual agreement gross billable rates are defined as all charges before any deductions for billing and collection, bad debt, reserve holdbacks, etc. Again, we emphasize that rates for service established by Cannon are either at or lower-than those tariffed by AT&T and the Regional Bell Operating Companies. Rates will not be changed without the express written consent of Upshur County.

The Cannon System ACP-9000 is monitored 24 hours a day by internal systems that provide alerts, often before a human is aware of a malfunction. As Cannon has both a full time staff in Dallas, and a network of local, experienced telephone experts, the rare service call gets quick response.

Cannon provides with each monthly statement and remittance to Upshur County a full financial accounting of all calls to confirm the accuracy of our payments to you. Statements and commission checks will be mailed on or before the 15th of each month following the billing of the calls by the local exchange carriers.

Cannon agrees to provide at no expense to Upshur County toll-free local calls from the prison to the local "Crime Watch" number.

Cannon agrees to provide at no expense to Upshur County for use in the jail, equipment mandated by the *Americans with Disabilities Act*. All of the telephone handsets will be hearing-aid compatible and others will be "wheelchair compatible." Upshur County may later specify such additional equipment as TTY keyboards, etc.

Cannon agrees that it will consult with designated management in the facility to determine the appropriate equipment for each area of the jail. As an example, Cannon will provide "wall unit" telephones in most areas that are equipped with short connecting cords.

Within the time parameters you allow, but not less than thirty (30) days after execution of an Agreement based on this proposal, Cannon will install at no expense to Upshur County the Cannon System ACP-9000 with sufficient inmate phones so as to allow each inmate reasonable and safe access to outside telecommunications, within the guidelines established by the your on-site management, and under the terms of this proposal. We will consult periodically with designated executives of Upshur County and of the facility.

to ensure that the changing needs served by this Agreement are met. While the self-monitoring characteristics of the Cannon System ACP-9000 detect virtually every potential malfunction, Cannon's operating policies include frequent contact with each location.

A Dallas-based representative of Cannon will have responsibility for coordinating the installation of equipment, supervising compliance with requirements of the various State regulatory agencies, quality control, and assignment of standby technicians for on-call services

In addition, Evercom will guarantee a monthly commission to Upshur County in the amount of \$3,880 00






